Getting to know your child as a Person and Learner Meeting

Staff will be doing all they can to get to know your child at the beginning of this term so they can enhance wellbeing and support and challenge each child to be the best that they

An important aspect of getting to know children is the "Getting to know your child as a Person and Learner Meeting" on Tuesday 18th and Wednesday 26th February.

These meetings provide 5 minutes dedicated 1:1 time for parents and teachers to meet and for you to share your

child's strengths, passions, your concerns, and aspirations and anything you think will help your child to be successful.

We will send home some question prompts the week before to ensure we maximise the time together. Please make a note in your diary for this now and look out for the School Interviews sign up on Monday 10th February for your time slot.

The Francis Xavier Way - Our Whole School Behaviour Management Program

At St. Francis Xavier teachers have successfully implemented and run a whole school Behaviour Management program. The program is based on Lee Canter's Assertive Discipline research and has clear a set of rules and consequences that we promote in both the classroom and playground. The ultimate aim of the program is to teach the children to manage their behaviour well - thus allowing them to focus on their learning and to build positive relationships.

At St. Francis Xavier:

- 1. We follow adult instructions immediately
- 2. We keep hands, feet and objects to ourselves
- 3. We do not call out
- 4. Swearing, teasing or calling others names is not welcome.

CareMonkey for school parents....

As you know we take the health and safety of your children very seriously. As such will continue with our use of **CareMonkey** as a health and safety program. It has been very well received by families since we began using it in 2015!



CareMonkey is an innovative parent controlled electronic medical form for schools, clubs and other groups with a duty of care. It's an electronic version of the paper based forms you're always having to fill in for excursions, camps, enrolments, etc.

As a parent you will have received an email or SMS from the **CareMonkey** system inviting you to enter the details for your child in an electronic medical form. **Please complete and update your CareMonkey details as soon as possible.**

School Fees

School Fee Payment Agreement Forms were sent home to all families last year. If you have not yet returned your form please complete it and return to the school office by Friday 7th February. This form is to be completed by all families on an annual basis.

For families that returned their forms last year, the direct debits have all been set up and will commence from the 20th February 2020. Attached to the newsletter is the direct debit schedule dates for 2020.

Family Fee Assistance Scheme

In all Ballarat Diocesan Catholic Primary Schools, tuition fee discounts are available to families eligible for a means tested Centrelink or Veteran Affairs concession card. The scheme offers tuition fee discounts to both Catholic and non-Catholic families, to new and current students. If you are eligible for the above concession card and require further information regarding this scheme, please contact the school office for more information.

Camps Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF)

Families holding a valid means-tested concession card or temporary foster parents are eligible to apply. \$125 per year is paid for eligible primary school students, with \$225 per year paid for eligible secondary school students. Payments are made directly to the school and are tied to the student.

Eligibility:

Families holding an eligible Centrelink Health Care Card, Pensioner Concession Card, Veterans Affairs Gold Card on the first day of Term 1 or first day of Term 2 or be a temporary foster parent will be eligible to apply.

Icy Poles

Icy poles are again available for children on Fridays. We require parents to pay up - front for icy poles. They are now \$4 for the term and payable via Flexischools. Please pay by 9:30am Friday the 7th February, if you would like your child to have them on Fridays.

Bus Transport for 2020

If there are any changes with regard to your child's transport from school for 2018 could you kindly fill in a Transportation From School form or contact the office with the relevant changes.

If you are a new family starting in 2020 and intend for your child to travel from school, please find attached the Transportation Form for you to complete and return back to the office.

Bus Procedures for Parents

- You need to notify the office if there is a <u>change</u> to your default (i.e. what you filled out on the form)
- Changes to the daily schedule would be appreciated as early in the day as possible – before 12.00pm midday.
- Changes to the daily schedule will be able to be conveyed to the office via telephone, by a bus pass which will be available from the office or by downloading and printing from our website.
- Changes to the daily schedule can also be communicated via the Skoolbag App, or via the generic "office" email office@sfxballarat.catholic.edu.au

Parent's Car Park - Traffic Movement 2020

Thank you to everyone who followed the arrangements/instructions for parking last week!

Traffic Movement Instructions:

- When turning at the top of Fortune Street to come back down to park - please go to the 2nd group of trees beyond the double lines and opposite the golf club marked with a LARGE X. Please go up to the cross in a single line and cross to come back down Fortune Street.
- There will be two large Witches Hats showing you where to cross back down Fortune Street.
- You may also go further up past the X Tree beyond the golf club to turn to come back down Fortune Street



Double Lines on Fortune Street

Double Lines are painted on Fortune Street adjacent to the St. Francis Xavier school grounds.

Double Lines rules state that is illegal to:

- 1. Overtake
- 2. U-turn
- 3. Right turn across the double lines from the left lane into a car park

The Double Lines have not been introduced to inconvenience people. Double Lines have been introduced to ensure that the SFX Community is kept safe and that sensible driver behaviour is encouraged.



Road Rules

- As a pedestrian only ever cross Fortune Street at the School Crossing.
- Parents please observe ALL 'No Standing,' 'No U-Turns,' 'One Way' and 'Bus Zone' signs.
- The Fortune Street Bus Zone is for BUSES ONLY. If you continue to park in the Bus Zone you do so at your own risk and may incur a fine.

If the road signage and markings are adhered to with a good level of patience a safe environment can be maintained.

For the safety of all - use the designated areas for parking and follow the rules. Police and Council patrols happen randomly and parents can and will be caught and fined.

Our St Francis Xavier Primary School App is very popular! Over 600 Downloads so far but we need ALL parents to Download it ASAP!!

What is Skoolbag?

Skoolbag provides schools with an easy way to tell parents/carers everything they need to know, and it provides parents with the most convenient way to receive school notifications.

No more lost paper in student school bags! School newsletters, school notices and alerts are communicated directly to the parent smartphone through the Skoolbag school Mobile App. Skoolbag is a school Mobile App that communicates directly with iPhone, and Android devices.

Instructions

Go to the Apple App Store and type in St Francis Xavier Primary School Ballarat and Install the App. It can be installed on an iPad but you need to select the iPhone version. The App is also available to Android users through Google Play. For google play its under St Francis Xavier Primary School Ballarat East

Communication

St Francis Xavier tries very hard to communicate with the school community, mainly through Newsletters, NewsBlasts, Facebook or the Skoolbag app, available to download through apple or android store. The newsletter is emailed every Monday and can be viewed online, information is available on the school website. Many classroom teachers are also using an app called SeaSaw to communicate directly with their class community.

We also welcome the opportunity to meet face to face but please be aware that these cannot happen during class time. If you wish to meet with a teacher it is best to either phone or email them to organise a time that is mutually agreeable to both. Teachers email addresses are created by using the initial letter of their first name with their surname followed by @sfxballarat.catholic.edu.au, eg. John Smith jsmith@sfxballarat.catholic.edu.au.

It is an expectation that all correspondence or meetings are held in a respectful and nonaggressive or abusive manner, in times of frustration, this can be a challenge for some people but all members of our school community (staff, students, parents and visitors) are entitled to be treated with dignity, it is at the heart of our Catholic ethos.

In 2015 the St. Francis Xavier School Board approved new policies for Concerns and Complaints and Expectations of Parents and Guardians at our school. Please find these attached for your perusal. Religious Education News



Mass for Opening of the School Year

Families are welcome to come and celebrate Mass with us on Friday 7th February. Mass is held at St. Alipius Church in Victoria St and begins at 9:30am. All student from Foundation to Year 6 will attend Mass. All children are required to wear their full school Summer Uniform.

Sacraments in 2020

From 2021, sacraments will be offered to baptised children of St Alipius Parish in the following grades:

- Year 3 Confirmation
- Year 4 Reconciliation and Eucharist

You may notice that the year levels have once again changed. This decision has not been made lightly. It has been taken due to a change in the leadership of the parish and the liturgical connection between Baptism and Eucharist. This will also bring St Alipius Parish more in line with sacramental practices in other parishes in the diocese.

Because of these changes, in 2020, the following sacraments will be celebrated in the parish of St Alipius:

- Year 3 Confirmation
- Year 4 Confirmation and Eucharist.

Parents will be asked to nominate the celebrations that would suit them best. These preferences will be distributed after enrolment into the sacraments and will be allocated in the order these are received. It is usual for students from a school to attend the weekends their school is hosting, but we understand this is not always possible and this can be discussed in 2020. There will be a small cost to cover the payment for the preparation booklets and iron on transfers for the sash. Parents will need to present their child's baptism certificate when they enrol their child. Prior to each sacrament, parents are expected to attend workshops with their child to help them prepare the children at home. The three schools support the parish in this endeavour. 100% attendance is expected at the workshops and parents may attend at any of the venues.

Baptism

If your child has been baptised since he/she started at St Francis Xavier Primary School, make sure you have informed us and you have sent a copy of the Baptism certificate to the school office. Your child will not be listed as Catholic in our school records and you may miss out on sacrament information.

If you are seeking Baptism for your child, please call the St Alipius parish office on 53326611.

Sacraments

If your child receives the Sacrament of Reconciliation, Eucharist or Confirmation at another parish, please let me know on bluckman@sfxballarat.catholic.edu.au so that I can keep our records as up to date as possible.

If your child has been baptised since he/she started at St Francis Xavier Primary School, make sure you have informed us and you have sent a copy of the Baptism certificate to the school office. Your child will not be listed as Catholic in our school records.

Classroom Helper Information Sessions

This term I will be facilitating two Classroom Helper Information Sessions:

Session 1: Friday 28th February at 9:30 am in the Staffroom **Session 2:** Tuesday 10th March at 9:30 am in the Staffroom

The Classroom Helper Information Sessions are for members of our community who would like to be involved as 'Classrooms Helpers'. These sessions will cover aspects of English and

Mathematics and provide helpers with important information required prior to supporting in classrooms.

Please note:

• If you are interested in becoming a Classroom Helper, you only need to attend one of the Classroom Helper Information Sessions.

- A valid 'Working with Children's Check' is required prior to commencing classroom support. Office staff require a copy of ALL cards prior to commencement.
- If you have attended a St. Francis Xavier Primary School Classroom Helper session in previous years, you do not need to attend another session.

You will however need to read, sign and return the following documents prior to commencement:

- St Francis Xavier Primary School Volunteer Duty Statement
- o St Francis Xavier Primary School Safeguarding Children and Young People Code of Conduct

Both documents can be collected from the Office.

Seesaw Update

This year, all classes will continue to use the online digital portfolio tool, Seesaw. Seesaw provides children with the opportunity to document and reflect upon their learning while strengthening their skills in the area of technology. Each child has their own Seesaw portfolio and throughout the year authentic assessment tasks will be uploaded to Seesaw. Specialist teachers will also be using Seesaw, and therefore you will notice that your child will be a member of multiple classes. If you have a current Seesaw account, you will not need to sign up to Seesaw again as 2019 classes have been archived.

If you require a Seesaw log in for your child, please see your child's classroom teacher.

Spelling Mastery

Spelling Mastery will commence next week. Spelling Mastery is a research -based program designed to explicitly teach children the strategies they need to become successful, life-long spellers.

Children in Years 3-6 will participate in Spelling Mastery five times a week, Monday through to Friday, from 9:00am to 9:20am. Placement tests have been completed along with observations from sessions last year, assisting the process of allocating children into groups according to their needs.

Spelling Mastery supports the children in developing an understanding of the relationship between sounds, word parts and spelling patterns. Children are taught in small steps, using sufficient practice, so that they comprehend how spelling works and transfer accurate spelling to their writing.
