



THIS WEEK'S GOSPEL - Sunday 21<sup>st</sup> March 2021

## FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT YEAR B

### Gospel

Jn 12:20-33

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

### If a grain of wheat falls on the ground and dies, it yields a rich harvest.

Among those who went up to worship at the festival were some Greeks. These approached Philip, who came from Bethsaida in Galilee, and put this request to him, 'Sir, we should like to see Jesus.' Philip went to tell Andrew, and Andrew and Philip together went to tell Jesus. Jesus replied to them:

'Now the hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. I tell you most solemnly, unless a wheat grain falls on the ground and dies, it remains only a single grain; but if it dies, it yields a rich harvest. Anyone who loves his life loses it; anyone who hates his life in this world will keep it for the eternal life. If a man serves me, he must follow me, wherever I am, my servant will be there too. If anyone serves me, my Father will honour him. Now my soul is troubled. What shall I say: Father, save me from this hour? But it was for this very reason that I have come to this hour. Father, glorify your name!' A voice came from heaven, 'I have glorified it, and I will glorify it again.' People standing by, who heard this, said it was a clap of thunder; others said, 'It was an angel speaking to him.' Jesus answered, 'It was not for my sake that this voice came, but for yours. 'Now sentence is being passed on this world; now the prince of this world is to be overthrown. And when I am lifted up from the earth, I shall draw all men to myself.' By these words he indicated the kind of death he would die.

### The Gospel of the Lord

### **REFLECTION by Greg Sunter**

### **Gospel Reflection**

This week's first reading from Jeremiah is a very powerful image and a foreshadowing of the message and ministry of Jesus. In the Jeremiah reading, the Lord announces that (yet again) a new covenant will be made between the people and their God. This time, however, the covenant will not be a collection of rules written in stone as was the case with the covenant of the Ten Commandments after the people had been led out of slavery in Egypt. The people have demonstrated that they are not able to uphold that covenant. This time, God declares that the covenant will be 'planted deep within them' and 'written on their hearts'. This is a wonderful image: I will write my covenant on your heart! It is the message that Jesus tried to convey over and over again – the Law of God is not to be found in a multitude of rules and regulations but it is a Law of the heart, calling for compassion and love.

This message is no better demonstrated than in this week's gospel passage. Jesus declares that, 'unless a wheat grain falls on the ground and dies, it remains only a single grain; but if it dies, it yields a rich harvest.' He is speaking of course about his own life, but he is speaking also to those around him and those of us who read the words today. Unless we are prepared to let go of our ego, our status, our 'reputation', for the sake of others and respond to them from the heart then we can never experience the breadth and depth of what it means to belong to a community. When we are prepared to let go of our hangups and reservations to make a difference in the lives of others then the 'harvest' that will be gathered from those actions will be great indeed!

### **Gospel Focus – Love of life**

Jesus says, 'Anyone who loves (their) life loses it; anyone who hates (their) life in this world will keep it for the eternal life.' This can seem pretty tough! It challenges us about how much we cling to the 'things' of this life. Are we concerned about the labels on our clothes; the number of our friends; how much money we have; the sort of house we live in? If this is the 'life' that we place meaning on, then we will surely lose it. However, if we put aside the world's focus on material things and focus our attention on others then we are assured of eternal life.

### Have you thought? Why Greeks?

The gospel reading begins with some Greeks wanting to meet Jesus. Why is it significant that they were Greeks? The Jews were very clear about the distinction between Jews and non-Jews (Gentiles). Regardless of their intentions and goodwill, a Gentile was simply not a Jew. Greeks, who worshipped an entire pantheon of gods, were regarded as almost as far from Jewish belief in one God as was possible. Yet Jesus made clear that his message was for everyone: Jew and Gentile alike. His death and resurrection would bring a 'rich harvest' of belief among Gentiles as well as Jews.

### Scriptural context – The Final Days

Today's reading reminds us that we are closing in on the events of the Passion that we will remember more closely over the next couple of weeks. Although the Gospel of John appears to have Jesus in and around Jerusalem quite often, the events described in this week's reading take place in the preparation for Passover, immediately before the final days leading up to Jesus' death and resurrection. It is a fitting culmination to the Sunday gospels of Lent. It prepares us for the account of the Passion that will be the gospel next week.

A beginning point for discussion of this week's Gospel with children:

Q. How is the image of the grain of wheat relevant to Jesus' life and mission?

Q. How do you think the disciples might have responded to what Jesus said in this gospel passage?

Q. What are some of the 'trappings' or 'things' of this world that people find difficult to let go of? Q. Do you know anyone who has put other people's needs before their own comfort and status?

### NAPLAN ONLINE- Tuesday 11<sup>th</sup> May – Friday 14<sup>th</sup> May, 2021

In May every year, students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 take part in the National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN). NAPLAN was first introduced in 2008 and has become a routine part of the school calendar in Australia.

NAPLAN is how the government; education authorities and schools determine whether young Australians are reaching important educational goals.

In 2019, our school made the successful transition to NAPLAN Online. Moving to NAPLAN online brought many new opportunities for our children and teachers that were limited or not possible with paper-based tests. This year again, we will administer the NAPLAN tests through the Online National Assessment Platform. Children will complete the tests via a secure locked down browser on a suitable device. The year three Writing test is the only test that will continue as a pen and paper assessment this year.

Some of the main benefits of students taking part in NAPLAN Online include:

- Better assessment and more precise results. NAPLAN Online uses a tailored test or adaptive design, where
  the test automatically adapts to individual student performance and asks questions that match the student
  achievement level, allowing the student to demonstrate their knowledge. This provides teachers and schools
  with more targeted and detailed information on students' performance on the tests. Tailored testing also
  provides an opportunity to broaden the scope of the assessments.
- **Faster turnaround of results.** Delivery of assessments online significantly reduces the time it takes to provide feedback to schools, students and parents, so teachers can respond more quickly to learning needs.

As technology develops, ACARA aims to further refine the delivery of the tests to best use the available technology to provide increasingly sophisticated assessments and valuable feedback to teachers, parents and education authorities.

### National Coordinated Practice Test (CPT)- Thursday 25<sup>th</sup> March, 2021

This Thursday Year 3 and 5 students will complete the National Coordinated Practice Test (CPT). The CPT is a 45minute test that aims to provide Year 3 and 5 students and staff with an opportunity to familiarise themselves with the different components of NAPLAN online and to replicate the same simultaneous maximum number of test sessions that will be undertaken during NAPLAN Online. The CPT will not provide us with student results.

### Book Fair

We are very excited to announce that the Book Fair is taking place this year! The Book Fair provides children with the opportunity to explore literature and select books of interest. The Book Fair is a great way to celebrate reading within our community with hundreds of fun, engaging and affordable books for the children to discover. Prior to the Book Fair, classes will be given the opportunity to view the selected books and write a wish list.

# National Day of Action against violence and bullying

Last week we continued to educate ourselves and our children about Bullying either face to face or online culminating with our wonderful Year 4 PB assembly on Friday.

The attached article is a continuation of this conversation as it is about Parents/ Carers needing to establish digital boundaries and be the pilot (for primary children) and copilot (for adolescents) of the digital plane.
