Dear Parents and Families,

At this time last year St. Francis Xavier announced that we would move Student Led Conferences from the usual time of Week 2 & 3 of Term 3. We made the decision to move these important meetings to the end of the term, in Weeks 9 & 10 to spread out evenly the Reporting Schedule. Holding the meetings later in the term also avoided a clash with Secondary Schools.

Due to the current COVID19 situation we have modified this year's conferences to offer them online and in the form of **3 Way Conversations**. These 3 Way Conversations will be offered in Weeks 7 to 10.

It is our aim that a **3 Way Conversation** actively involves parents, children and teachers reflecting on student growth as a learner, while acknowledging the most important participants in the learning process – children, teacher and parents/carers. This team looks at the evidence shown in the student's learning and listens as the child talks about their learning growth.

In short, **3 Way Conversations** provide a forum to develop a student agency for children, parents and teachers to acknowledge student progress and achievement. They are a valuable avenue for involving parents and children in the learning process and helping parents understand the teaching, learning, assessment and reporting process. It's an opportunity to celebrate their child's achievements. The **3 Way Conversation** benefits the children, parents and teachers.

This is a quick note to inform you that St. Francis Xavier's digital forms and school operations platform provider, CareMonkey, will be rebranding as '**Operoo'**: School processes, without the paperwork.

Operoo's mission is to help schools eliminate operational inefficiencies so that every dollar and every minute possible can be spent on a students' education.

The name change will occur the week beginning Monday 3rd August. How you use the service, as well as the ownership and operation of the company, will remain unchanged.

You can continue using the system, and its mobile application, as usual. Just be aware that, after Monday 3rd August, emails and notifications sent from the system will start appearing under the new name '**Operoo**'. You will also be automatically diverted to the new **Operoo** website if you go to the old CareMonkey website.

We look forward to continuing to digitize, streamline and automate St. Francis Xavier's operations with **Operoo**.

Bus Procedures for Parents

School Health and Safety Measures return for children

The return to onsite school attendance is based on the advice of the Victorian Chief Health Officer. We have considered a variety of strategies to support physical distancing, particularly among adults, and good hygiene practices to reduce the risk of COVID-19 transmission within the practical limitations of our school environment.

Any child who is unwell must not attend school.

Beginning of the Day Drop Off

At no stage are parents able to enter any classroom. Red Tape and Distance markers will be outside each classroom door to remind all adults.

From Wednesday 27th May, parents will be required to drop their children off in the undercover area and then exit the school in a prompt manner. Staff will be present in the undercover area from 8:30am to assist children with walking to their classrooms if required.

People Bouncing Back

In our SEL (Social and Emotional Learning) sessions this term, the whole school has a focus on the topic People Bouncing Back. The key messages that we are sharing with the children are:

People can bounce back just like balls bounce back.

Bad times don't last. Things always get better.

Other people can help if you talk to them. Get a reality check

Unhelpful thinking makes you feel more upset. Think again

Nobody is perfect- not you, not others

Concentrate on the positives (no matter how small) and use laughter

Everybody experiences sadness, hurt, failure, rejection, and setbacks sometimes, not just you. They are a normal part of life. Try not to personalise them.

Blame fairly. How much of what happened was due to you, to others and to bad luck or circumstances?

Accept what can't be changed but try to change what you can first.)

Catastrophising exaggerates your worries. Don't believe the worst possible picture.

Keep things in perspective. It's only p[art of your life.

Our first session in our **Seasons for Growth** began on Wednesday. Our group looked at the 4 Seasons and how they show us about change in our lives
