School Attendance - Unexplained Student Absences

From the commencement of 2018:

- Parents/guardians are responsible for contacting the school on that day of an expected absence to inform them and to provide an explanation for their absence.
- This must be done prior to the commencement of the school day.
- This may be done by contacting the school on (03) 5331 6311 directly, by leaving a message on the school answering machine, email: office@sfxballarat.catholic.edu.au or via (Caremonkey/Skoolbag App).

Where an unexplained absence is identified the school will:

- Make all reasonable attempts to contact the parents/guardians that morning. **This will in the first instance be done via an automated text message.**
- Where no response is received by the parents/guardians that morning a subsequent phone call will be made to seek an explanation.
- In the event that contact cannot be made with the parents/guardians the school will attempt to communicate with emergency contact/s nominated on the student's file.
- **Where there is no response and there are concerns for the safety and welfare of the student contact may be made with Victoria Police (000).**

Mid-Year Reports

Currently teachers are working hard to moderate your children's work to ensure that their reports are accurate and up-to-date with where their learning is positioned. I commend them for the energy, thoroughness, sincerity and professionalism that they bring to their report writing.

As communicated to families, St. Francis Xavier Primary School continues its firm commitment to working in partnership with parents to enable our children to achieve their best. In 2021 St. Francis Xavier is continuing the use of (PAM) *Parent Access Module* for delivering school reports. This online system provides parent's access to a range of information specific to your child including Mid and End of Year Reports.

We are aiming to have the mid-year reports available on PAM from Friday 25th June.

Head Lice – Frequently asked questions

Please visit <http://www.health.vic.gov.au/headlice/faq.htm> for important information on Head Lice and how to treat them. I am asking all families to take these notes seriously. I thank all families who have contacted the school when lice are found. It is the only trigger I have to inform other families that there is a problem in the school. Some families are struggling with the lice problem constantly reoccurring.

There are only 2 reasons for this:

- the cycle of reinfestation has occurred because a family has not followed the appropriate follow-up to ensure eradication
- another family is being left untreated and causing reinfestation of treated families. This is a very serious issue and causes much anguish within families.

Please ensure that your family is clear of lice and that you follow the conditioner method to ensure that you are regularly managing these little critters. Please don't wait until your child has lice....make the conditioner method a part of your normal routine within the family.

HAND AND FINGER STRENGTH!

Hand and finger strength is important as it is required for many everyday activities such as doing up buttons and zips, climbing monkey bars or cutting up a piece of steak at mealtimes. It also helps to develop the endurance to complete activities such as writing a full page.

Here are some activities kids can do at home to work on their hand strength that doesn't require special equipment or too much time or effort.

- Play with water toys that require squeezing.
- Squeeze out a sponge before wiping down the kitchen table or bench.
- Use a spray bottle to water plants.
- Get dressed and undressed by yourself.
- Carry shopping bags.
- Cooking – mixing, sifting, kneading or use a rolling pin or cutters.
- Peel, grate and cut up fruit or vegetables. Start with easier to cut foods such as bananas or cucumbers and build up to harder foods such as carrots or potatoes.



This week, Catholic schools around Australia are celebrating Catholic Education with the theme "Faith in the Future". Here at St Francis Xavier we know the history of our school and the overwhelming contributions of the Sisters of Mercy to its development. Our school prayer begins: "Loving God, our school has a history. Help us to honour that history, implement our vision and live out our call."

It traces the beginnings of Catholic education in Parramatta, NSW, the arrival in Australia of all the different religious brothers and sisters, including our own Sisters of Mercy in 1846, the work of St Mary of the Cross Mackillop in 1866, to government decisions of the last century granting funding to Catholic schools. It's a great read and gives a fascinating overview of the past 200 years.

Why do we ask the students to share what they have?

St Francis Xavier Primary School is a Catholic school. Our Vision Statement says we are 'called to action through Gospel values and Mercy tradition'. This means that we teach Catholic Christian values to our students. These are

inspired by the behaviour of Jesus, who healed the sick, helped those in need and cared for all people no matter their nationality or religion.

The teachings of the Catholic Church on social justice issues are grounded in the Bible and the wisdom gathered from experience by the Christian community. Here is a summary of four of the Catholic Social Teachings that are most relevant for our casual day donations.

- Human dignity

All life is sacred, every person has inherent dignity and worth. Human rights and responsibilities are founded in this essential, shared human dignity.

- The common good

People have responsibility for one another in their shared life together, and are called to work for the common good of all. Catholic Christians must advocate for a just society in which all people, particularly the vulnerable and marginalised, are able to flourish and meet their needs.

- Solidarity

Humans are social by nature and depend on one another. We seek to stand in unity with each other, particularly those who are powerless or disadvantaged, and recognise each person's rights regardless of our differences.

- Preferential option for the poor

The needs of the socially disadvantaged and vulnerable are prioritised.

THIS WEEK'S GOSPEL - Sunday 23rd May 2021

PENTECOST SUNDAY YEAR B

Gospel

Jn 20:19-23

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John.

As the Father sent me, so I send you: Receive the Holy Spirit.

In the evening of the first day of the week, the doors were closed in the room where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews. Jesus came and stood among them. He said to them, 'Peace be with you,' and showed them his hands and his side. The disciples were filled with joy when they saw the Lord, and he said to them again, 'Peace be with you.

'As the Father sent me, so am I sending you.'

After saying this he breathed on them and said: 'Receive the Holy Spirit. For those whose sins you forgive, they are forgiven for those whose sins you retain, they are retained.'

Gospel Reflection

The feast of Pentecost celebrates the power of the Holy Spirit coming upon the disciples and energising them to set about their mission of continuing the ministry of Jesus. The gospel reading is one of the post-resurrection appearances by Jesus when he breathed the Holy Spirit upon the disciples. The actual events of that first Pentecost are recorded in the book of Acts and are recalled in this week's first reading. The use of this post-resurrection gospel account is a reminder that Jesus had already imbued the disciples with the Spirit but, as so often throughout his ministry, they were a bit slow to catch on to the significance of what he had done. It seems that they needed a more tangible experience to jolt them into action and Acts records the very physical experience of the Spirit entering their midst as a roaring wind before settling upon them as tongues of flame. Jesus had breathed the Spirit upon them but it took the roaring wind to make a real impression on the disciples. There are frequent references in the gospels to Jesus being 'filled with the Spirit'. It is this Spirit with which he was filled that he breathed upon his disciples; it is that same Spirit that we receive sacramentally in Confirmation.

For the weeks following the death of Jesus the disciples had lived in fear and confusion, not fully understanding what had happened and not really knowing what to do. When they realised that the Spirit Jesus had breathed upon them was really present and urging them to action they finally had the courage to begin the mission that Jesus had entrusted to them: to spread the Good News of Jesus and continue to realise his message in the world.

Historical Context – Pentecost

The word Pentecost comes from the Greek for fiftieth day. Pentecost Sunday ends the season of Easter and comes as a Sabbath day after seven weeks of seven days. In Jewish tradition the 50th day after the Passover was celebrated as a blessing of the harvest and rather than the unleavened bread of Passover it was celebrated by leavening the bread. It was for this reason that the disciples were gathered together when they experienced the Holy Spirit empowering them. In Christian tradition, Pentecost is celebrated as the arrival of the Spirit, promised by Jesus, that animated the disciples to spread the gospel of Jesus and gather believers to form what would eventually become the Church.

Have you thought? The Spirit

We can sometimes regard Pentecost as the day the Holy Spirit came into the world. However, the Spirit had long been active in the world before this event. In fact, even the second verse of Genesis Chapter 1 tells us that the Spirit hovered over the waters. The Old Testament is filled with references in which 'The Spirit of God came upon (him) with power' and the Spirit was evident at Jesus' baptism and throughout the gospels. Jesus is frequently described as being 'filled with the Spirit'. So, from the very beginning of creation the Spirit has moved in the world and continues to energise it today.

Living the Gospel – Come, Holy Spirit

'Come, Holy Spirit', or its Latin, Vene Sancte Spiritus, has become the basis of countless prayers and hymns over many hundreds of years. To this day, it remains a powerful invocation that can be used in prayer or meditation. Three simple words convey a wealth of meaning. The invitation for the Spirit to 'Come' indicates recognition of the need for the Spirit's intervention and openness to accept the guidance that the Spirit brings. It is a powerful, simple prayer that can be used at the outset of any significant undertaking or whenever you find yourself in need of inspiration.

A beginning point for discussion of this week's Gospel with children:

- Q. In what ways was the Pentecost experience, 50 days after Easter, the 'right time' for the disciples?
- Q. What emotions may the disciples have felt on that day?
- Q. How would you have reacted if you were in the disciples' place?
- Q. What is the relationship between Jesus and the Holy Spirit?
- Q. Where in your life could you use the guidance and strength of the Spirit?
