Process for Booking Onsite Child Supervision at St. Francis Xavier Primary School

ALL eligible families need to follow the process for booking children for Onsite Supervision.

Bookings are open from today, Thursday 15th July and parents are able to book their children.

1. Instructions for Booking:

- Bookings are made through Care Bookings (a similar program to School Interviews). The school code is **JSCEC** and will not change.
- Please click on the link and follow the online instructions:

- Bookings are open from 4:00pm, Thursday 15th July.
- Bookings close 5:00pm the night before for the following days. No late bookings will be accepted.

Due to resourcing and supervision ratio requirements, Onsite Supervision is only available for students who cannot be cared for or learn from home. This is to ensure that we are protecting our staff, students, and families to the greatest extent possible and is in line with Coronavirus restrictions.

Learning From Home - 5 - Day Snap Lockdown

Learning from home through our Connected Learning Communities will begin on Friday 16th July 2021. We recognise that there will be challenges along the way, and we are here to support you through this time. Our teachers will be working very hard to plan and prepare meaningful learning experiences for your children and will continue to respond to questions, provide feedback to children and make phone contact with families from Friday between the hours of 9:00am - 3:30pm.

Connected Learning Communities (CLC)

As per previous arrangements Home Learning in the CLC, the following still applies.

- Overview CLC planning documents from Foundation to Year Six will be uploaded to Seesaw on Friday afternoon between the hours of 3:00pm and 5:00pm. This will provide families with time to read the documents and plan for home learning for the following week.
- Daily activities relating to and referenced in the CLC overview planners will be uploaded to Seesaw at 8:00am from Friday through to Tuesday.
- Morning assemblies with Mr. Bissinella and Mrs. Clark will resume!
- From Friday 16th July, children will be provided with the opportunity to connect and check-in with their teacher and peers daily via the platform Zoom (please click on the link <https://zoom.us/> for further information regarding Zoom).



SIXTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME YEAR B

Gospel

Mk 6:30-34

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark

They were as sheep without a shepherd.

The apostles rejoined Jesus and told him all they had done and taught. Then he said to them, 'You must come away to some lonely place all by yourselves and rest for a while'; for there were so many coming and going that the apostles had no time even to eat. So they went off in a boat to a lonely place where they could be by themselves. But people saw them going, and many could guess where; and from every town they all hurried to the place on foot and reached it before them. So as he stepped ashore he saw a large crowd; and he took pity on them because they were like sheep without a shepherd, and he set himself to teach them at some length.

The Gospel of the Lord

Gospel Reflection

Fifty years ago the word 'stress' was only ever applied to materials like steel and the wings of planes. But since then, along with 'pressure', it has first crept into our language and more lately become an everyday term. Everyone experiences stress now. You can even hear Grade One students talk about the stress they're under at school! Perhaps it's the ever-growing pace of life or an innate competitiveness but pressure and stress have become part of daily life for most people in the so-called civilised world. Although he may never have used the words 'stress' or 'pressure', Jesus knew all about the demands of ministry with other people. When the disciples returned from their first efforts away from Jesus he knew that they needed some time out to debrief, to pray and to re-energise themselves. He ordered them all into a boat and they headed for a lonely place where they could be by themselves and rejuvenate. Jesus recognised the importance of taking time out. If you are engaged in a vocation or ministry that sees you meeting the needs of others, you need some time out to reflect on your experiences; time to hold those people up to God in prayer; time to make sense of your work and the interactions you've shared; time to simply recharge your batteries so that you can once again give fully of yourself.

Unfortunately, when Jesus arranged for himself and the disciples to have some time out, the crowd anticipated where they were going and actually beat them there! When the disciples arrived at their lonely spot, they were once again overwhelmed by the crowd. However, Jesus recognised the demands of the crowd as being more urgent than the demands of the disciples and himself. He took pity on them – he was moved by compassion – and responded to their need.

Have you thought? Prayer and reflection

Jesus demonstrated how important it is to engage in times of quiet prayer and reflection. When you expend a lot of time and energy in the service of others it is essential to reflect on those experiences, to learn from them and consider what you'd do differently next time. It is also important that any ministry that seeks to be based in the message of Jesus can only remain so if it is fuelled by prayer. Only through prayerful dialogue with God can we learn what God desires for us.

Living the Gospel – Take time out

I recently travelled to France and was amazed that in the smaller towns and villages everything stopped for two hours in the middle of the day and people went home for lunch. As a tourist used to almost 24 hour convenience, it was at first terribly frustrating. Even tourist attractions would close down. The only businesses open were restaurants. However, the wisdom of the custom soon became apparent. How wonderfully civilised and life-giving to stop for two hours in the middle of the day, go home and have a leisurely lunch. It made me ask myself, 'When do I take time out to renew myself?'

Historical Context – Sheep and Shepherds

This gospel passage is one of many gospel references and even more Old Testament references to sheep and shepherds. It is an enduring image from the Bible. Much of it stems from the shepherd-become-King, David. When a monarchy developed in Israel it was clear that the role of king was like that of a shepherd, caring for his flock. Jesus applied the image to himself on several occasions, reinforcing an image of servant leadership. The language continues today, with bishops referred to as shepherds of their diocese and carrying a crozier that is reminiscent of a shepherd's crook.

A beginning point for discussion of this week's Gospel with children:

- Q. Why was Jesus keen for the disciples to go away to a lonely place?
- Q. Why did Jesus abandon his plans and respond to the crowds?
- Q. What benefits can flow from taking time for reflection and prayer?
- Q. Where and when do you create time for quiet and reflection in your life?
- Q. How might you better do this?

Greg Sunter has worked in Catholic Education (Brisbane) for many years, most recently as a member of the Religious Education team and Mission and Formation team. He has extensive experience of praying with young people and forming others to lead prayer with young people. He is the author of books on adolescent faith, is a regular speaker at youth and evangelisation conferences, and is a retreat and reflection facilitator and presenter. His areas of interest include religious education, theology, scripture, spirituality, Catholic ethos, prayer, and ministry with young people.

Children and their Emotions.

As parents and caregivers we want to protect our children and want them to be happy. We need to remember that despite this, it's okay for our kids not to always be happy!

It is important for children to learn to tolerate unpleasant feelings and realise some feelings are uncomfortable. In fact, it's essential for healthy growth that they experience a wide range of emotions in a safe place without shame, punishment or distraction.

We need to normalise their feelings of worry, anxiety, sadness, anger, and embarrassment as part of being a human! Children need to realise although they may not like the feeling and discomfort, they can cope with it.



Sometimes as adults WE feel uncomfortable with our child's emotions and try to "fix" them or the situation.

We may need to ask ourselves why we are so uncomfortable when our children are feeling unhappy, sad, angry or disappointed?

Being human means knowing ALL emotions are okay and welcome. Feeling what you are feeling is okay. If you can help your child develop meta-cognition — the ability to think about their thoughts and keep from getting stuck within them — and mindfulness, which helps them become a gentle, nonjudgmental observer of their thoughts and feelings, attuned in the moment to their experience, then you are giving them psychological tools to help them for a lifetime.
