Questions to ask your child at Student - Led Conferences.

Here are some questions for you to ask your child during their Student – Led Conference. These are suggestions, so please look them over and pick a few that you would like to ask!

- 1. What are you most proud of?
- 2. It makes me proud to see that
- 3. Can you tell me more about ...?
- 4. I can tell that you improved in
- 5. What did you find challenging this term?
- 6. Did you reach your goals? Why/Why not?
- 7. What can we do together at home to support your learning?

The purpose of these meetings is to celebrate, affirm the children's learning and promote Student Voice. Parents and teachers will be able to ask questions of the children during these meetings in regards to their achievements, challenges, effort, behaviour, goals and next steps in their learning. We are certain that these conversations can happen with the child present with our teachers up-skilling the children to lead these conferences with confidence.

We have deliberately formed them as Student – Led and not 3 – Way Conferences. In response to the recommendations of our 2016 School Review we have developed a Strategic Educational Plan with the support and approval of the School Board and targeted promoting Student Voice across the school. Highly Effective Catholic Primary Schools promote Student Voice. Student – Led Conferences are identified as a significant way of developing Student Voice and all the latest research and evidence around Assessment as Learning supports this. If a parent needs to have a conversation with the teacher not in the presence of the child in regards to other matters, this needs to take place at another time. Contact can be made with the class teacher requesting further time if needed.

The Gospel of the Lord

REFLECTION by Greg Sunter

This entire scene is a conspiratorial 'set-up' to trap Jesus. Jewish law dictated that adultery was to be punished by death for both parties. However, the Roman occupation had forbidden the Jewish authorities to carry out the death penalty. By bringing the woman to Jesus they sought to place him in a no-win situation. If he upheld the Jewish law and ordered the death penalty, then he was flaunting Roman law. If he did not uphold the law then he could be branded as a false teacher. They thought it was a perfect trap!

But where is the man with whom the woman was committing adultery? When he is not also brought forward for judgment as any legitimate accusation would demand, Jesus senses the trap being set for him. He realises that those accusing the woman must have somehow been involved in setting her up so that she could be 'caught committing adultery'. In Jewish law, accessories to a crime were equally guilty and subject to the same penalty. When Jesus says to the gathering, 'If there is one of you who has not sinned ...,' he's letting them know that he's aware of their part in this crime and what judgment is due them also! If they persist with their accusation, they'll also be tried as accessories! So they quietly walk away.

Jesus' words to the woman sum up his message throughout the gospel: 'Neither do I condemn you, go away, and don't sin any more.' As with others in the gospels, Jesus recognises that the woman has indeed sinned, but he does not condemn her for it. By telling her not to sin any more he is calling her to conversion. He is saying, yes, you've made mistakes, but you can do better and I'm challenging you to try.

Gospel Focus - Restoring honour

When the accused woman is brought before Jesus for judgment he neither looks at the woman nor at the accusers. He bends down and writes in the dirt. When the accusers melt away, Jesus (still kneeling on the ground) looks up at the woman to speak to her. She has probably never been treated with this level of respect in all her life. With this action, as much as anything else, Jesus restores dignity and honour to the woman. No longer looked down upon, she can begin a new life.

Living the Gospel - Forgiven, not forgotten

The words Jesus speaks to the accused woman could as easily be addressed to each of us. We all feel at times that we've done the wrong thing – something we don't deserve to be forgiven for. However, Jesus says to us, I know you've done the wrong thing, and you are already forgiven, but you need to make a commitment to change and not repeat the error. It is Jesus' promise not to give up on us – not to forget about us – that we can draw strength from as we try to respond to his challenge to change.

Scriptural context - Jerusalem

This gospel passage begins with Jesus going to the Mount of Olives. We know the Mount of Olives best from the passion narratives in the synoptic gospels. But today's passage is not part of the last week of Jesus' life. The three synoptic gospels generally portray the ministry of Jesus as something of a journey towards Jerusalem and have him arriving just in time for the Passover and his arrest. However, the gospel of John places most of Jesus' ministry in and around Jerusalem to better focus the tension between the teachings of Jesus and the Jewish hierarchy.

A beginning point for discussion of this week's Gospel with children:

- Q. Why did the Pharisees see this incident as a test for Jesus?
- Q. What is achieved by Jesus bending down and focusing his attention on the ground?
- Q. What happened to the mob mentality when Jesus challenged them?
- Q. Have you ever been in a situation where group behaviour overtook individual thought and action?
- Q. When Jesus says, 'Go, and don't sin any more,' how can that be applied to your life?



Helping Children Cope With Change

Throughout life we all experience challenging times- if the last two years and covid have taught us anything, it's that our life is filled with twists and turns (sometimes when we least expect it!)

Changes and challenges are a part of life and we cannot protect our children from unpleasant events- in fact these encounters give them experience in building their coping capacities and developing emotional resources that contribute to their maturity.

Next term I will be beginning Seasons for Growth groups for children who have experienced grief and loss. Children who have not previously attended this group will be given priority this year to ensure it is targeting children with similar situations/ experiences.

1. GIVE THEM TIME TO PREPARE

When preparation is an option, give your child plenty of advance warning that a major change is coming. This allows them time to process and begin to accept the change.



2. LISTEN TO THEIR CONCERNS

Take time to address your child's questions and concerns. Help them work through the emotions that they're feeling.

If your child struggles to name what he is feeling, help him label the emotion (e.g., anxious, sad, nervous, worried, or scared).



3. READ BOOKS ABOUT BIG LIFE CHANGES

There are plenty of children's books written to help kids cope with major life changes.

4. KEEP ROUTINES THE SAME

Give your child as much consistency and stability as possible. Bedtimes and mealtimes in particular should remain consistent. Structure feels safe for children, so provide as much of it as possible to restore a sense of safety.



5. PROVIDE CONNECTION AND PLAY

Remain consistent is your child's connection with you. Make sure your child knows that no matter what else changes, you aren't going anywhere, and neither is the bond you have with your child.



6. GIVE THEM CHOICES AND ASK FOR HELP

During a big life change, children feel that they have no control over their lives. Give some sense of agency by allowing your child to make small choices:



- · What color does he want to paint his bedroom at the other parent's home?
- · What should you cook for the first meal in the new house?
- · What outfit does he want to wear for his first day at a new school?

7. TALK ABOUT OTHER CHANGES

Talk about things they successfully coped with in the past. They might include:

- Starting school
- · Joining the soccer team
- Getting a new pet
- · Going to first grade
