

Religious Education News

Children's liturgy – Pentecost (Year C)

Today Jesus tells the disciples that if they love him then they will keep his commandments; and that once he has left them, he will send the Holy Spirit to guide and protect them. Let's find out more ...

Gospel: John 14:15-16, 23-26

Jesus said to his disciples "If you love me, you will obey my commandments. I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Helper, who will stay with you forever. Those who love me will obey my teaching. My Father will love them, and my Father and I will come to them and live with them. Those who do not love me do not obey my teaching. And the teaching you have heard is not mine, but comes from the Father, who sent me.

I have told you this while I am still with you. The Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything and make you remember all that I have told you."

(Gospel passage taken from Good News Translation®)

Gospel reflection: Today is the feast of Pentecost. We remember that Jesus sent the Holy Spirit to be with his disciples. Pentecost means 50 in Greek as the Holy Spirit came to the disciples 50 days after Easter.

Jesus asked his friends to love one another as he has loved them; and he says that God will send the Holy Spirit to be with them forever and to help them. The Holy Spirit will teach the disciples everything they need to know once Jesus has left and will remind them of Jesus' words while he was with them.

God lives with us in our hearts. God is always there and the Holy Spirit is always guiding us to do what is right. Let us be guided by the Holy Spirit, who was given to the disciples on the first Pentecost and is still with us today, to show our love for God and for other people.

- 4. Level of attainment in the form of a dot on a continuum for the learning areas explicitly taught in Semester

 - English (Reading & Viewing, Writing, Speaking & Listening)

This comment made me laugh and helped me change my thinking. When we take the time to understand our child's perspective, problem solving gets easier.


Sometimes we forget that our children are wearing "L" plates while they learn how to do life.

P.E. in Year 6 Last week, the Year 6 classes started a four week Sport Education, Physical Education Program (SEPEP) unit. The selected sport is Korfball. SEPEP is a student-centred approach to Physical Education which takes the best parts of community sport to enhance

student learning. It allows students the opportunity to be involved as players, in team roles such as captain, coach and sports board member, and also in duty roles such as umpire, scorekeeper and timekeeper. SEPEP is designed to develop cross curricular links with other curriculum areas. For example, statistical analysis

can be used as part of Maths. It can be used as an approach to meet a number of the learning outcomes of the National Health and Physical Education Curriculum.

SEPEP can be an important part of a well-balanced and comprehensive Physical Education program that caters for all ability levels and extends learning beyond that of a traditional Physical Education program.

Peer teaching becomes a feature as students want their team to do well and help other students to succeed. There are social benefits for students through working with others in a variety of situations.

The roles the Year 6 students have applied for include: Sports Board; Umpire & Rules co-ordinator; Results co-ordinator; Publicist / Media / Communications; Captain; Coach / Selector; First aid officer; Equipment manager.

The media / communications team look forward to sharing with you updates on how their round-robin season is progressing.

Golf Clinics Students in Yr 4 - 6 will be participating in Golf Clinics with Tony from Golf Vic later this term. Each class in Yr 4 - 6 will be involved in 2 x 45min clinics, and from this Tony will help us select a squad to participate in a primary school golf tournament later in Term 3 at Mt Xavier GC.
