Covid Update advice from Acting Chief Health Officer as of 11:59pm Friday 24th June 2022

As part of the changes, from 11.59pm Friday 24 June 2022, parents and carers who have COVID-19 can transport their non-COVID-19 children via private vehicle to their primary or secondary school when an alternative person is not available to assist. This will include school holiday programs held on school grounds.

This means that parents and carers will be able to leave COVID self-isolation to take their non-COVID-19 child to school or school holiday programs via a private vehicle. The parent or carer must travel directly to and from the school only. They must remain in the vehicle at all times, unless it is reasonably necessary to leave the vehicle to walk the child to and from the entrance of the school safely. They must wear a face mask at all times.

Please contact the school office and we can make arrangements for meeting your child at the front gate. Family members are asked to continue reporting positive COVID-19 cases to the Department of Health.

You must also let the school know if your child is a close contact. **Students who are close contacts and want to attend should still take 5 RATs over 7 days and wear a face mask whilst indoors if they are aged 8 years or over.** Students should continue to stay home if they are unwell, even if they test negative on a RAT. Thank you for your support as we continue to make these adjustments.

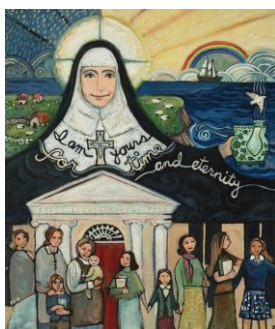

to his teaching. Martha was upset over all the work she had to do, so she came and said, “Lord, don't you care that my sister has left me to do all the work by myself? Tell her to come and help me!”

The Lord answered her, “Martha, Martha! You are worried and troubled over so many things, but just one is needed. Mary has chosen the right thing, and it will not be taken away from her.”

Gospel reflection: Jesus is welcomed into the house of a woman called Martha. Martha has a sister called Mary who is pleased to see Jesus and immediately sits down to hear him speak. Martha is busy with tasks. Perhaps she is getting Jesus a drink, making him some food, making sure he has everything he needs.

What does this story teach you about listening to Jesus?

When should we be busy and when should we be quiet?

Both are important in our lives but we need to get the balance right. Spending time quietly can help us sort out our ideas and feelings, we can listen to God who helps us think things through and we can work out what God is asking us to do next. Quiet time can help us to recognise Jesus in other people and to see how we can help each other.

Our Challenge: Do you make time for other people when they want to talk to you?

This week make some time for doing what God asks of us, treating all people with kindness, generosity, love and respect.

My son always had a great imagination so when he turned 4 we got him a dollhouse full of little people, furniture and even a pet. His face would light up when we would sit down to play together and we spent many hours telling each other stories and acting them out

One day a neighbour was over visiting and she laughed when she saw the dollhouse- she made a comment that I had a house full of boys so why did we have a girl's toy?

She didn't *intend* any harm, but I couldn't help being annoyed. Because *gender stereotypes can be really harmful* and there are a lot of them directed at our children. Saying things like, "that's only for girls/boys," indicates to children that there is shame in expressing themselves freely. Gender expectations limit choices and behaviour. It doesn't matter if the gender expectation is positive or negative, it serves to perpetuate stereotypes and inequality.

This term in our Respectful Relationships program (as part of our Social and Emotional Learning) we will be exploring topics on stress management, help-seeking and gender and identity. You can support our learning at home, by your words and modelling of respectful relationships. The attached Parenting Ideas focuses on ways Dads (but I think parents of all genders) can communicate from their hearts as well as their heads, finding words to support, heal and advise when their children struggle.

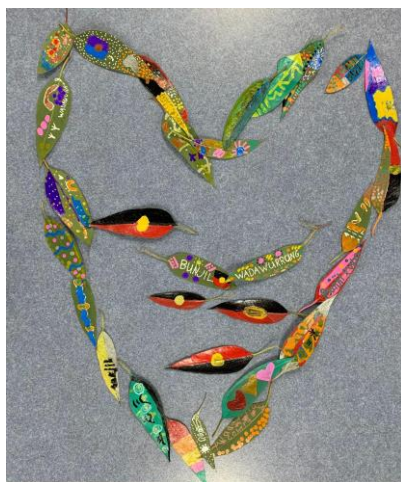


NAIDOC Week 2022

Last week, the students and staff of St. Francis Xavier Primary School came together to celebrate NAIDOC Week and further developed our collective knowledge of the history, culture and achievements of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples, in particular the Wadawurrung People, the traditional custodians of the land upon which we live, learn and play. Here's a taste of some of the activities we have been immersed in:

BUNJIL ART INSTALLATION As part of their learning experience, the students have been learning about **Bunjil** (represented as a wedge-tailed eagle) the creator spirit for the Wadawurrung people and the Kulin Nation, who created the lands, waters, plants, and animals of Wadawurrung Country, before creating the people, whom he created to respect and care for Country. We still see him today watching over Country as one of the North Stars, brightly shining beside the Southern Cross.

Throughout the week, each student received a native gumleaf, upon which they created their own artwork depicting what Wadawurrung Country means to them. These will be collected and collated to create the feathers of **Bunjil**. Our finished Bunjil Artwork will be displayed in our school for all to view, along with a description of our creation and our School RAP statement. We look forward to unveiling this in the coming weeks.



NAIDOC WEEK ART GALLERY VISITS Last week our Year 2 and 3 children were very lucky to visit the Art Gallery of Ballarat to participate in a NAIDOC week workshop with Wadawurrung artist and emerging elder Dr Deanne Gilson.

During the workshops we went on a tour of the many wonderful Indigenous artworks in the gallery before creating a bird for the Tree of Knowledge using traditional ochres.

Our SFX students were super impressive with their Wadawurrung knowledge, their enthusiasm for the experience and their respectful behaviour in the gallery.

A reminder to our families that visiting the Art Gallery of Ballarat is free of charge and such a wonderful experience!
