THIS WEEK'S GOSPEL- Sunday August 28, 2022 Twenty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year C)

Gospel: Luke 14:1, 7-14 On a sabbath day Jesus had gone for a meal to the house of one of the leading Pharisees; and they watched him closely. He then told the guests a parable, because he had noticed how they picked the places of honour. He said this, 'When someone invites you to a wedding feast, do not take your seat in the place of honour. A more distinguished person than you may have been invited, and the person who invited you both may come and say, "Give up your place to this man." And then, to your embarrassment, you would have to go and take the lowest place. No; when you are a guest, make your way to the lowest place and sit there, so that, when your host comes, he may say, "My friend, move up higher." In that way, everyone with you at the table will see you honoured. For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and the man who humbles himself will be exalted.' Then he said to his host, 'When you give a lunch or a dinner, do not ask your friends, brothers, relations or rich neighbours, for fear they repay your courtesy by inviting you in return. No; when you have a party, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind; that they cannot pay you back means that you are fortunate, because repayment will be made to you when the virtuous rise again.' (Gospel passage taken from Good News Translation[®])

Gospel Reflection: Jesus basically is telling the people, "Why do you care about getting first place to prove that you are important? You are chasing what you already have. God already likes and loves and honours and respects you. God already thinks you are important!" Jesus is teaching the people about respecting others- he said if we treat people with respect, then others would treat us with respect.

Our Challenge: We are all deserving of respect. What are some ways you can show respect this week at school, work and in our community?


Assessment & Reporting - Student Led Conferences
