THIS WEEK'S GOSPEL- Sunday September 11, 2022 Twenty-fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year C)

Gospel: Luke 15:1-10

One day when many tax collectors and other outcasts came to listen to Jesus, the Pharisees and the teachers of the Law started grumbling, "This man welcomes outcasts and even eats with them!" So Jesus told them this parable:

"Suppose one of you has a hundred sheep and loses one of them—what do you do? You leave the other 99 sheep in the pasture and go looking for the one that got lost until you find it. When you find it, you are so happy that you put it on your shoulders and carry it back home. Then you call your friends and neighbours together and say to them, 'I am so happy I found my lost sheep. Let us celebrate!' In the same way, I tell you, there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over 99 respectable people who do not need to repent.

"Or suppose a woman who has ten silver coins loses one of them—what does she do? She lights a lamp, sweeps her house, and looks carefully everywhere until she finds it. When she finds it, she calls her friends and neighbours together, and says to them, 'I am so happy I found the coin I lost. Let us celebrate!' In the same way, I tell you, the angels of God rejoice over one sinner who repents." (Gospel passage taken from Good News Translation®)

Gospel reflection: Have you ever lost something that was very important to you? How did you feel when you lost it and what did you do to try to find it?

In the reading, even though it was only one sheep or one coin, it was still very important and valuable to the person who had lost it. In the same way as in the stories, all people are valuable to God, nothing in creation is more important or precious than another.

We are all different and special. God cares for us and loves us.

We can try to recognise everyone's special gifts and talents and help everyone to feel safe and happy.

Our Challenge: This week, do what is right and share God's love for everyone with all the people that you meet, particularly those people who seem lonely or sad.

School holidays are almost upon us and for many parents the struggle to keep their children from spending all day on their devices is real! Without any balance or rules to manage their screen time consumption, many kids would happily spend their days streaming and scrolling. And, likely, everything coming across their screen isn't rich educational content. But even if it was, too much screen time can be detrimental. There are generally four different ways we



consume screen time- creating content, communicating with others, interacting (like playing games), or passively consuming (binge watching Netflix). While the quality of all screen time isn't the same, the quantity still matters.

Some parents use a checklist children need to complete each day, including chores, personal tasks and some educational and screen-less activities to focus on balance in their life- you may like to try something similar. In my house I make a calendar on the fridge outlining plans for the holidays, just so we keep some routine and structure.

In the attached article, Justin Coulson looks at ways we can encourage our children to play more. We know that play time encourages children to develop their interests, practice making decisions and solving problems, learn to regulate their emotions, assess and respond to risk, develop socially,

and most importantly, facilitates access to joy- all of which contribute to good mental health and wellbeing.

Camp Quality Puppet Show This week to coincide with our Footy Colour Day and fundraising for childhood cancer, we welcome the team from Camp Quality. Their Cancer Education Program, featuring the Camp Quality Puppets, visits primary schools and preschools across Australia to deliver cancer education and help dispel myths, confusion and anxiety that can follow arise from a cancer diagnosis.

The puppets provide interactive and age-appropriate education for any child impacted by cancer – whether they are dealing with their own diagnosis or the diagnosis of a sibling, parent/carer, family member or friend. This program helps to create a shared language to facilitate cancer conversations within the school community and attached to the newsletter is a parent information sheet about this incursion.

SFX Football Jumpers & Singlets If you have any SFX Football jumpers or singlets at home could you please return them to either Mr Down or Mr Carroll.


