School Procedures for the Bushfire Season

The Department of Education and Training (DET) has recently advised the Catholic Education Commission of Victoria (CECV) of the revised Bushfire At-Risk Register (BARR).

As a consequence of this review, St Francis Xavier School has been listed on the 2022-23 BARR and will be required to close on days with a fire danger rating listed as Catastrophic.

The following information will help us plan and prepare our school to support the safety of staff, students and the wider community.

Assessing bushfire and grassfire risk

Schools and early childhood education services are categorised based on their risk of bushfire and grassfire in line with the Victorian Education Facility Bushfire Risk Methodology and review this classification annually.

To inform this classification, we have used the Commonwealth Scientific and Industrial Research Organisation (CSIRO) analysis informed by the Bushfire Management Overlay, Victorian Fire Risk Register, and terrain and fuel type exposure.

Our school's risk

Our school is rated as CAT 3. This means that St Francis Xavier Primary School:

Must close on days forecast as 'Catastrophic' by the Bureau of Meteorology within our designated fire district.


Australian Fire Danger Rating System

In September 2022, Australia introduced a new fire danger forecasting system, the <u>Australian Fire Danger Rating System (AFDRS)</u>. A nationally consistent system will more accurately predict fire danger and produce clear, simple messages for communities. Victoria has been using a 6-tier system for fire danger ratings, from 'Low' or 'Moderate' to 'Code Red'. The AFDRS will replace the Victorian system this year and uses 4 tiers of fire danger, from 'Moderate' to 'Catastrophic'.

Fire danger ratings describe the potential level of danger should a bushfire start.

They are important because they provide people with information so that they can take action to protect themselves and others from the potentially dangerous impacts of bushfires.

From September 1, Australians will have a simplified, action-oriented Fire Danger Rating System.



- The AFDRS will also introduce 'off' for those days where no proactive action is required by the community.

 On these days, you will still need to abide by local seasonal laws and regulations, but there is little or no risk of a fire that starts spreading in a dangerous or life-threatening way.
- The AFDRS is informed by one of Australia's largest social research projects which found that most Australians do not understand the current system, and would prefer a simpler, action-oriented set of fire danger ratings.
- The AFDRS is being implemented consistently across Australia and will mean that wherever you are across the country, you will be able to understand the threat posed on any given day and make appropriate decisions to keep you and your family safe.

What can parents do?

Make sure we have your current contact details, including your mobile phone numbers. Keep in touch with us by reading our newsletters, by checking our website http://www.sfxballarat.catholic.edu.au/, and by talking to your child's teacher or any other member of the teaching staff.

THIS WEEK'S GOSPEL- Sunday October 2, 2022 Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year C)

Gospel: Luke 18:9-14 Jesus also told this parable to people who were sure of their own goodness and despised everybody else. "Once there were two men who went up to the Temple to pray: one was a Pharisee, the other a tax collector. The Pharisee stood apart by himself and prayed, 'I thank you, God, that I am not greedy, dishonest, or an adulterer, like everybody else. I thank you that I am not like that tax collector over there. I fast two days a week, and I give you a tenth of all my income.'

But the tax collector stood at a distance and would not even raise his face to heaven, but beat on his breast and said, 'God, have pity on me, a sinner!' I tell you," said Jesus, "the tax collector, and not the Pharisee, was in the right with God when he went home. For those who make themselves great will be humbled, and those who humble themselves will be made great." (Gospel passage taken from Good News Translation®)

Gospel reflection: The two men behaved very differently in the temple.

The Pharisee is full of pride- he thinks he's done everything right, that God must love him very much and that he's better than other people.

The tax collector is humble and ashamed- he knows he has done wrong and he knows that only God could give him the forgiveness and mercy he needed.

No matter who we are, where we come from, the colour of our skin, whether we are rich or poor, tall or short, we are special in God's eyes. God loves us all very much.

Our Challenge: This week try not to judge others just because they are different to you. Try to treat all people you meet with kindness and respect. (adapted from the CAFOD website)

After a 3 year hiatus due to Covid, the SFX Art Exhibition is back!


