Enterprise Bargaining Agreement 2022

You may be aware that there have been ongoing negotiations regarding working conditions for educators now for some time. After a long and protracted period of negotiations, the enterprise bargaining agreement entered into in 2022 has now been settled. This means that our staff and all who work in education can expect to hear of improved working conditions in the coming months. Once this has been approved at government level we can expect that our school will be called to revise some of the conditions in which we currently operate. We will wait until we receive more information in the weeks ahead before we make any changes to the way that our school operates so that we can be sure that any decisions made will be in the best interests of all concerned. We are so fortunate at St. Francis Xavier to have such a dedicated staff group who care for all students in exceptional ways, through the new agreement we hope that we can also ensure that we are looking after those who care so much.

THIS WEEK'S GOSPEL- Sunday July 9, 2023 Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year A)

Gospel: Matthew 11:25-30

At that time Jesus said, "Father, Lord of heaven and earth! I thank you because you have shown to the unlearned what you have hidden from the wise and learned. Yes, Father, this was how you wanted it to happen.

"My Father has given me all things. No one knows the Son except the Father, and no one knows the Father except the Son and those to whom the Son chooses to reveal him.

"Come to me, all of you who are tired from carrying heavy loads, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke and put it on

you, and learn from me, because I am gentle and humble in spirit; and you will find rest. For the yoke I will give you is easy, and the load I will put on you is light." (Gospel passage taken from Good News Translation)

Gospel reflection: Today we hear Jesus calling all people who are working hard, who are tired and struggling to come to him. Jesus knows that we all have times when we find life difficult. We all have times when we are tired, fed up and would like to give up.

Jesus says his yoke is easy. He does not mean an egg yolk! This yoke is spelled differently. It is a sort of wooden bar that farmers around the world use to make it easier to pull heavy ploughs. Jesus is saying that he will help us, that he is always there to comfort and support us and that when we are tired or finding things difficult, we can turn to him and find rest.

Just knowing that we are not alone can make a big difference when we are finding life hard. God is with us always, when we are alone, but also in the people who help and support us.

Our Challenge: Let's look after others who are finding things difficult and do our best to help them. We can show them that they are not alone by the way we treat them.

What will you do to help someone who is finding life difficult, who is tired or struggling?

Reflection on the Gospel

Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time: Matthew 11:25-30

Today's gospel begins with Jesus' prayer of thanksgiving to God. The verb "to thank" in this instance has connotations of blessing. In this prayer, Jesus contrasts those who consider themselves wise and intelligent with the truly wise ones, the "little ones" who know the daily struggle to survive, those to whom the secrets of God's empire have been revealed. The prosperity gospel that affirms the acquisition of wealth is far removed from the words proclaimed by Jesus. God's ways turn human expectations upside down.

The final verses of today's gospel are among the best known and best loved in all of the gospel tradition. "Come to me...and I will give you rest" is a lovely invitation. It is issued to those who are weary and burdened and that includes most of us at some time or another. We might hear it as addressed to the First Peoples of Australia and to African Americans who are weary and burdened by waiting for justice. We might equally hear it spoken to those in war-torn countries like Yemen and Syria and Afghanistan. The "rest" that Jesus offers is God's rest. It is not just relief from drudgery and hard

work. In the biblical tradition. rest is shabbat. It is freedom from any sort of enslavement. It is freedom to remember God's goodness in creation. Rest time or shabbat is about making a space to contemplate the wonder of the galaxies, the wonder of life in all its forms and all its potentialities. God's rest restores life to our wearied spirits. It frees us to open ourselves to ever new possibilities and to be there for others. Spending a little time each day with a poem or a beautiful painting can be an experience of entering into God's rest.

Learn of me, for I am gentle and humble of heart

"Take my yoke upon you..." is Jesus' further invitation. The same verb will be used when Jesus tells his disciples, "If any want to become my followers, let them ... take up their cross and follow me." The "yoke" of Jesus, the cross that he will take up, and the cross that his disciples are invited to bear, are all of a piece. A yoke is a crossbeam or cross-bar. Jesus will carry his cross-beam to execution.



Disciples, in their turn, will carry their cross-beams, figuratively if not literally. They will not be weighed down or burdened by this prospect for the "yoke" of which Jesus speaks is "easy". How can this be? The answer lies in the final invitation: "Learn of me, for I am gentle and humble of heart..." In Matthew's beatitudes, the gentle are said to be blessed. There is nothing weak about the gentle ("meek" is not a helpful translation). The non-violent methods of the gentle are infinitely more effective in restoring creation than the violence of so many who present themselves as "wise and intelligent". God's "rest" is the source of their power - and of ours.
