THIS WEEK'S GOSPEL- Sunday February 18, 2024 Children's liturgy – First Sunday of Lent (Year B)

Gospel: Mark 1:12-15

At once the Spirit made [Jesus] go into the desert, where he stayed forty days, being tempted by Satan. Wild animals were there also, but angels came and helped him.

After John had been put in prison, Jesus went to Galilee and preached the Good News from God. "The right time has come," he said, "and the Kingdom of God is near! Turn away from your sins and believe the Good News!" (Gospel passage taken from Good News Translation®)

Gospel reflection: In our gospel story Jesus goes out into the desert for 40 days (the number 40 in the bible is not literal- in Jesus' time it was used to indicate a long period of time). He had hardly any food to eat or water to drink-Jesus might have been hungry, thirsty, afraid and lonely. Sometimes we feel like this- who are the "angels" that help us?

Today is the first Sunday of Lent. Lent lasts for 40 days, just like Jesus' time in the desert. Lent is a special time when we prepare for Easter. We take time in Lent to think about how we live our lives. This time can help us to change for the better and grow in our faith. As we grow closer to God, we also realise that we are called to put our faith into action, and to live our lives as God wants us to, loving and caring for all people and for the earth.

Our Challenge: How can we support each other and our brothers and sisters around the world, as we try to live as God calls us to? Could I share what I have by bringing a coin to donate to Caritas?

Can I be an "angel" to someone who needs my love or support today?

Wellbeing News

After the excitement of the beginning of the 2024 school year as well as meeting their new teachers and friends, some children begin to realise this thing called education and school is going to take up a significant amount of their time!

Parents can assist in this by modelling positive coping strategies, having a growth mindset and acknowledging how their children are feeling. The connection that you have with your child is the most important support that can be given!

For any little ones (or even big ones!) struggling with separation anxiety as they get back into the routines of school, here are a few simple little tips which can be so effective in supporting emotional feelings they may be having.

Thank you to Dr Mary O'Kane for these strategies from her book Perfectly Imperfect Parenting!



Matching Love Hearts:

Draw a little heart on your wrist and a matching one on your child's. If they are missing you during the day, or just feel the need to connect with you, they can put their fingers on the little heart. They will feel their pulse, like a reassuring heartbeat, when they touch their wrist. Let them know that you will press your love heart if you are missing them. You can also add a spray of perfume or aftershave to their wrist as another little connection to you. Familiar smells are always such a comforting thing.

Pebble in my Pocket:

Find two very similar pebbles, gem-stones or crystals. You keep one in your pocket and your child keeps the other in their pocket. Tell them that any time they feel a little nervous or are missing you they give their pebble a little squeeze. This can be a very concrete reminder of their connection to you.





Worries in my Pocket:

Talk to your child about any worries or big feelings they have about school. Write these worries down on a piece of paper. Tell your child you are going to carry their worries for the day or overnight, so they don't have to carry them alone. This can really help to ease any fears they may have.

COMMISSIONING MASSES

On Pentecost Sunday, the Parish will commission new and recommission existing liturgical ministers, including readers, extraordinary ministers of the Eucharist, PowerPoint operators, musicians, sacristans, and welcomers. Information on how to sign up to continue or start volunteering in one or more of these ministries, and what the tasks involve, will be provided in the coming weeks, continuing this week with the music/visual display operator and PowerPoint slide-making ministries.

MUSIC AND VISUAL DISPLAY

The Vatican's Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy states that Christ is present when the church prays and sings, for he promised, "Where two or three are gathered in my name, there am I in the midst of them" (Matthew 18:20.) Each week our masses are enriched with pre-recorded hymns, or choirs and musicians who lead our singing. The lyrics, longer prayers and other information are presented on the churches' visual display screens via PowerPoint slides. A small group of volunteers are rostered to take turns updating these slides and selecting the hymns. Another group take turns operating the laptop and projection equipment during mass. These operators occasionally make brief announcements before or during mass. Musicians select the hymns they will sing, practice them, and then perform during mass. These tasks all require certain levels of skill and confidence, but fulfilling these ministries is something that you can train and practice for and are vital liturgical roles that add so much to our celebration of mass.

LAUDATO SI'

In his encyclical Laudato Si', Pope Francis reminds us that everything is connected. Our relationship with nature is not separate from our relationship with God and others. This concept of integral ecology encourages us to care for the Earth and each other. It calls us to action.

The Diocesan Social Justice Commission, in collaboration with Caritas (Diocese of Ballarat), Earthcare Ballarat and the Pastoral Ministry Office, encourages us to "Think before you buy."

A great way to reduce waste is to think about whether you need something before you buy it. See if you can buy second-hand rather than new. Buying from small local businesses is also a good way to reduce your environmental impact.

Believe the Good News

Gospel reflection by Veronica Lawson RSM 1st Sunday in Lent: Mark 1:12–15

Lent comes around each year and presents us with its usual challenge to take stock of our lives, to see more clearly what is in our hearts and to discover what might be calling us out of our comfort zones.

It is a time to consider how we might respond to the pain of the world and of its inhabitants.

It is a time for personal as well as group reflection, a time for entering into "the wilderness" and for grappling with the mysteries of life.

It is a time of preparation for Easter when we will renew our baptismal vows and celebrate the greatest mysteries of our faith.

The gospel reading invites us to reflect on Jesus' forty-day experience in "the wilderness".

Jesus is said to be "filled with the Holy Spirit" and, like so many human beings before and since, is "led by the Spirit" into the wilderness of life to be "tested" there. ["Tested" is a more accurate translation of the original Greek term than is "tempted"].

Forty is a symbolic number in Israel's story: the great flood lasts forty days and forty nights; Moses spends forty days and forty nights on the mountain of God; Israel wanders for forty years in the wilderness; King David reigns for forty years; the prophet Elijah travels forty days and forty nights in the wilderness on his way to the mountain of God.

The wilderness of Judah, with its unique desert flora and fauna, its wadis, and waterholes, is ever so real.

His message is to repent

At the same time, it functions symbolically in the narrative. In Israel's story, it is the place of testing for God's people: "Remember the long way that your God has led you these forty years in the wilderness... testing you to know what was in your heart" (Deuteronomy 8:2).

Jesus now passes the tests that Israel failed in the wilderness.

Jesus is "with the wild beasts". This terse statement recalls the prophet Isaiah's vision of a future time of reconciliation and harmony when "the wolf will lie down with the lamb" (Isaiah 11:6-9). Jesus is presented as the one who ushers in that age of peace and healing of division.



God's agents care for him in his time of testing: "angels minister to him". In this context, Jesus announces the coming of God's empire or reign.

His message is to "repent", "think again", to take stock in a way that might turn lives around in God's direction, and to "believe the good news" that he is set to proclaim in word and action.

The call to repent is a call to expand our thinking and to change our behaviour.

At a time of growing divide between the mega-rich and the desperately poor, we might look back to our symbolic tradition and forward to ways of bringing good news to those most deeply affected by the inequities in our world.
