Dear families,


Our Year 3 and Year 5 students have been participating in the national assessment program for literacy and numeracy (NAPLAN) over the past week along with all students in Years 3, 5, 7 & 9 across Australia. The testing program finishes this week which marks an important time for our students to formally explore their learning and to celebrate their academic progression as learners.

Throughout the year all students are assessed in many different ways. Our staff assess students for prior knowledge, during the learning process and of course, at the completion of a learning cycle. Even daily observations help the teachers to alter programs according to student needs. Differentiation takes many forms too. Sometimes extra assistance may be required to help master skills or understandings. Sometimes extension will be required when a student has mastered the necessary skills and is able to take their understandings further. By knowing each individual learner, our staff can cater for their needs each day.

Do you remember what learning was like for you at school? Perhaps you recall mastering a concept quickly or needing some extra help to learn what was required. Learning is just about as individual as the learner but when we build positive learning relationships, our students feel safe to challenge and be challenged at school. Feeling confident and safe to learn is what school is all about.

THIS WEEK'S GOSPEL- Sunday March 17, 2024 Fifth Sunday of Lent (Year B)

#### Gospel: John 12:20-33

Some Greeks were among those who had gone to Jerusalem to worship during the festival. They went to Philip (he was from Bethsaida in Galilee) and said, "Sir, we want to see Jesus."

Philip went and told Andrew, and the two of them went and told Jesus. Jesus answered them, "The hour has now come for the Son of Man to receive great glory. I am telling you the truth: a grain of wheat remains no more than a single grain unless it is dropped into the ground and dies. If it does die, then it produces many grains. Those who love their own life will lose it; those who hate their own life in this world will keep it for life eternal. Whoever wants to serve me must follow me, so that my servant will be with me where I am. And my Father will honour anyone who serves me" (Good News Translation)

**Gospel reflection:** Just like the song lyrics "From Little Things, Big Things Grow"-one single seed can grow lots of food. Think about how tiny an apple seed is inside your apple, which you can plant and grow into an apple tree that will produce lots of other apples. Can you think of some other foods that can be grown from a single seed?

Just like a seed, our actions, even if we do just one little thing, can also grow into something big, especially if we join together with others. For example if I want to make the world a fairer place, on my own I am easy to ignore. but if all of us come together and get our friends and our families to join in too, we are much harder to ignore! Through his death and resurrection, Jesus showed us one person can start a movement to change the world and in community we are strongest. Jesus calls us all to follow him, in all that we do and be the best people we can be.

**Curriculum News** 

Student - Led Conferences at SFX: Your child(ren) will be showcasing their schoolwork and discussing learning goals with you through Student-Led Conferences this week and next. During Student – Led Conferences, your child will lead the discussion with you about their school work, while teachers will help direct conversation and answer questions you may have. Bookings for these conferences are open on PAM now! If you haven't already done so please go in and book.

These meetings will last for 15 minutes, and we encourage all families to attend. Children must attend these meetings!

We have several goals for holding conferences using this format:

- · For parents/carers we hope that you will get to see rather than simply being told about your child's progress
- · For students we hope students will take more responsibility for their learning
- · For teachers we want teachers to have more meaningful and impactful conferences with you
- For all we want to maximise our time together, create ways to partner with one another to support student success.

## Questions to ask your child at Student - Led Conferences

Here are some questions for you to ask your child during their Student – Led Conference. These are suggestions, so please look them over and pick a few that you may like to ask!

- 1. What are you most proud of?
- 2. It makes me proud to see that ....
- 3. Can you tell me more about ...
- 4. I can tell that you improved in ....
- 5. What did you find challenging this term?
- 6. Did you reach your goals? Why/Why not?
- 7. What can we do together at home to support your learning?

We have deliberately formed them as Student – Led and not 3 – Way Conferences. Highly Effective Catholic Primary Schools promote Student Voice. Student – Led Conferences are identified as a significant way of developing Student Voice. The latest research and evidence around Assessment as Learning supports this.

If a parent/carer needs to have a conversation with the teacher not in the presence of the child in regards to other matters, this needs to take place at another time. Contact can be made with the class teacher requesting further time if needed.



**NAPLAN:** Our NAPLAN tests are well under way. All children have applied themselves to each test and we are really proud of their efforts. The photo shows you how we administered these tests in our gym. Well Done to our children in Years 3 and 5. NAPLAN is how governments, education authorities and schools determine whether young Australians are reaching important educational goals. Once our results are delivered we will unpack them as a staff.

## And I Will Draw All to Myself

## Gospel reflection by Veronica Lawson RSM

5th Sunday in Lent: John 3:14-21

Today's gospel tells us that among those who go up to Jerusalem to worship at the feast of Passover are some "Greeks".

The reference is probably to a group known in the early church as "Godfearers", although that designation is found only in Luke's second volume, the Acts of the Apostles.

These people were, in relation to Judaism, a bit like RCIA candidates in the Catholic tradition. They were certainly interested in Judaism and, because of their active interest in the Jewish faith, were possibly better informed about many of the Jewish traditions than those who had been members of the Jewish community all their lives.

God-fearers seem to have been among the first Gentiles (non-Jews) to join the early Christian Jewish movement, i.e., the Jews who accepted Jesus as Messiah (or Christ).

For Jesus, the arrival of these Godfearing Greeks signals his "hour".

Earlier in John's gospel, Jesus has insisted that his "hour" had not yet come. Now that his message receives global acknowledgement, or in the words of the Pharisees, now that "the world has gone after him" (John 20:19), he can announce that the hour of his glorification has come.

Characteristically, Jesus uses a potent agricultural image to capture the transformative nature of his imminent death: like the grain of wheat, he must go into the earth and die in order to bear fruit.

The same is true for his followers: to be concerned only with selfpreservation is to "lose" one's life; to give one's life is to "keep it for eternal life".

## He must die to bear fruit

Although the language is more explicit in John, the grain of wheat image echoes some aspects of the first reading from the prophet Jeremiah (31:31-34).

Jeremiah presents the God of Israel as One who forgives and who is even prepared to forget the sins of the past.

The people will be God's garden: the seed planted within them is God's Law. They will be God's own billboard: the law of forgiveness and mercy will be written in their hearts.



John uses the "eternal life" metaphor in much the same way as the other gospel writers use the "reign of God" or "kin-dom" image. To keep one's life for "eternal life" has to do with living God's transformative vision for creation in the present so that it might one day be fully realised.

In John's gospel, Jesus' death is also his being lifted up in glory. The moment of his death becomes the moment of drawing "all" to himself.

The "all" includes all people but is not restricted to the human community. It also allows for an ecological interpretation: in his death and exaltation, Jesus gathers the whole Earth community into the mystery of God's redemptive and transforming love.
