A Reminder About Our Parent Code of Conduct As part of the DOBCEL school community, St Francis Xavier Primary School follows important guidelines designed to keep our students safe and supported. One of these is our Parent Code of Conduct, which outlines expectations for all members of our school community.

A recent update to this document includes guidelines around photographing children at school events. In line with our Child Safety Standards, parents are now asked to only photograph or film their own child. If you'd like to include other children in any photos or videos, you must first gain consent from their families.

We understand this may be a change from past practice, but it reflects best practice for keeping all our students safe.

This will particularly apply to assemblies, excursions, and camps, where group photography has been common in the past. We kindly ask all families to support this approach and help us maintain a safe and respectful environment for every child.

THIS WEEK'S GOSPEL- Sunday May 18, 2025 Fifth Sunday of Easter (Year C) Gospel: John 13:31-35 After Judas had left, Jesus said, "Now the Son of Man's glory is revealed; now God's glory is revealed through him. And if God's glory is revealed through him, then God will reveal the glory of the Son of Man in himself, and he will do so at once. My children, I shall not be with you very much longer. You will look for me; but I tell you now what I told the Jewish authorities, 'You cannot go where I am going.' And now I give you a new commandment: love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. If you have love for one another, then everyone will know that you are my disciples." (Gospel passage taken from Good News Translation)

Gospel reflection

Jesus tells his disciples that he will not be with them much longer and he tells them how he'd like them to continue his work. Jesus told the disciples to love one another, just as he had loved them. What do you think this means? How did Jesus show his love for people?

Jesus spent time with people, especially those who were sick, lonely, frightened or poor. He listened to them and ate with them. He healed them and he helped them to change their lives for the better.

Do you think this message to love other people was just for the disciples? What do you think Jesus wants us to do?

Our Challenge: What will you do to show your love for others this week?



As we move further into Term 2, our teachers have begun preparing for the end of Semester 1 reports. This is a valuable time for reflection on each student's learning, progress, and growth so far this year. Teachers are carefully reviewing assessments and classroom observations to provide a clear picture of achievement.


This semester there will be a slight change to our Mathematics reporting. In line with updated guidelines from the Victorian Curriculum and Assessment Authority (VCAA), each student will now receive **one progression point dot** for Mathematics, rather than the three progression point dots used in previous years.

Reporting Updates

- Reporting is against the Year Level Achievement Standard NOT the Content Descriptions.
- Schools must implement reporting against Mathematics Version 2.0 in Semester 1 2025.
- There will be 1 progression point for Mathematics as a whole; not against each Strand.

150TH GORDON PARISH ANNIVERSARY

On May 9th 1875, St Patrick's Church Gordon, although incomplete, was opened by Archbishop James Alipius Goold OSA, Later in that year, Gordon was declared a parish of the Archdiocese of Melbourne, with Fr. Richard Ellis the first Parish Priest. The area of the parish was extensive, comprising of Gordon, Millbrook, Ormond, Mt. Egerton, Ballan, Mt Blackwood and Bacchus Marsh districts. In a new chapter for the Parish in 1980, St Patrick's Parish Gordon, Ballan and Springbank was transferred from the Melbourne Archdiocese to the Ballarat Diocese. After Mass all are invited to St Patrick's Primary School to view the display of photos and memorabilia and share a light lunch.

The Ways of Love of Discipleship

Reflection on the Gospel-Easter 5C (John 13:31-35)

The literary context for today's gospel reading is Jesus' final meal with his disciples. Jesus has washed the feet of his weary table companions whom he addresses affectionately as "dear friends" ("little children" in some translations) and has thus provided an example of what it means to love. What he has done for them, they are to do for one another. In other words, no form of service is too menial for a Christian disciple and privileged exemption from service of others has no place in gospel living or in gospel leadership. Pope Francis has witnessed powerfully to this from the beginning of his papacy and in diverse ways over the past twelve years of his papacy.

Jesus is said to be "troubled in spirit" (v. 21) at this meal. There is a sense of foreboding in this statement. He knows that membership of the group is no guarantee of fidelity or of sustained goodness. All are capable of betrayal and Judas, who has been one of his closest companions, is about to hand him over to the authorities and ultimately to death. Another of his disciples, Simon Peter, after protesting undying loyalty will proceed to deny him three times (vv. 37-38). Although troubled and no doubt disappointed by the failure of his friends and the dire consequences for himself, Jesus continues to teach the way of discipleship.

The betrayer's departure from the meal, Jesus informs them, signals the imminent arrival of the moment of glorification. Events have been set in train that will culminate in God's victory over evil and death. But this is not the end of their association with him. He will leave them very soon and they are to continue on the way of discipleship. His legacy to them is "a new commandment" – to love one another just as he has loved them. If they do that, everyone will know they are his disciples. To love as Jesus loved, however, is no small thing: it is to be willing to give one's life for the sake of "the other".

This new commandment to love one another is also Jesus' legacy to us, the successors of those early disciples. A dear friend of mine volunteered to care for the wounded in Ukraine last year. Countless medical professionals are laying down their lives for the beleaguered people of Ghazza, Ukraine, Myanmar and Sudan. Loving care of the broken-hearted, of the warravaged and displaced, of the sick and the weary; providing shelter for the homeless; attentiveness to those grieving the loss of loved ones or of livelihood; a restorative gesture or word; a change in lifestyle or a tree planted in the interests of planetary survival these are some of the ways of love and of discipleship. In our times, we have come to realise that "the other" embraces the more-than-human and that love of all God's creation is part of the new commandment.
