

#### **Religious Education News**

THIS WEEK'S GOSPEL- Sunday June 8, 2025 Pentecost (Year C)

#### Gospel: John 14:15-16, 23-26

Jesus said to his disciples: "If you love me, you will obey my commandments. I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Helper, who will stay with you forever.

Those who love me will obey my teaching. My Father will love them, and my Father and I will come to them and live with them. Those who do not love me do not obey my teaching. And the teaching you have heard is not mine, but comes from the Father, who sent me.

I have told you this while I am still with you. The Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything and make you remember all that I have told you."

(Gospel passage taken from Good News Translation)

#### **Gospel reflection:**

Today is the feast of Pentecost, where we remember that Jesus sent the Holy Spirit to be with his disciples. Pentecost means 50 in Greek as the Holy Spirit came to the disciples 50 days after Easter. This passage is part of the last conversations Jesus has with his disciples before he dies and so he is preparing them to live without his leadership. Jesus tells the disciples that if they love him, they will do as he has asked them. Jesus asked them to love one another as he has loved them, and tells them that God will send the Holy Spirit to be with them and to help them. Let us be guided by the Holy Spirit, who was given to the disciples on the first Pentecost and is still with us today, to show our love for God and for other people.

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


#### Reports Semester 1 2025

#### Please note a small change to this semester's Mathematics reporting.

In line with updated guidelines from the Victorian Curriculum and Assessment Authority (VCAA), each student will now receive **one progression point dot** for Mathematics, rather than the three progression point dots used in previous years. All year levels will only have one dot and no previous dot from last year.

Our dedicated teachers are currently engaged in moderating and compiling your child/ren's work samples and assessment results to ensure that Semester One reports are accurate and reflective of each student's progress. I extend my sincere thanks to our teachers for the energy, care, and professionalism they bring to this important task. As always, St Francis Xavier Primary School remains committed to working in partnership with parents and carers to support every child in reaching their full potential. #### **PAT Reading Adaptive Assessments**

Over the past few weeks, classes have been completing the PAT Reading Adaptive assessment. This tool helps us gain a clearer and more accurate understanding of each student's reading progress. Because the test adapts to each student's ability, it provides a fairer and more personalised snapshot to support our Semester 1 reporting.



#### **PAT Reading Adaptive**

- Assesses reading comprehension, covering four strands:
  - o Retrieve
  - Interpret implied
  - Interpret explicit
  - Reflect
- Provides five text types
- Automatic assignment of students' entry levels
- Personalised test pathways determined by student responses
- Multiple choice and complex multiple choice questions, administered in 45 minutes
- Mapped to the Australian Curriculum and Victorian Curriculum
- Designed for students in years 1-10

#### **Wellbeing News**

Child Safe Standard 9: Physical and online environments promote safety and wellbeing while minimising the opportunity for children and young people to be harmed.

Making meaningful connections with your children doesn't have to be a time consuming thing. Sometimes you don't even have to prepare things in advance - you can have "mini-connections" throughout the day whether that be while driving them to school, standing in line at the supermarket or when they are hanging around in the kitchen wondering what's for dinner.

You need to find out what works for you! Dr Matt Sanders, from the Positive Parenting Program, suggests trying to spend small chunks of time with your child - even as small as two minutes at a time - frequently throughout the day.

Time that is important to your child - when they approach to tell you something, show you something special, ask a question or to involve you in their life.

When these moments take place and you are not busy with something important, try to stop what you are doing and be present with your child for just a brief period of time.

It takes a bit of practice to really tune in but it can be strong in growing positive relationships with your child. This plan of action also works a treat for partners/family/friends and work colleagues as well!

Attached is a link to the SFX <u>SchoolTV</u> website with a few further ideas on how to achieve positive connections with your child. The Positive Parenting Series shares the four major responsibilities necessary for good parenting from The National Academy of Sciences.

#### LOUD FENCE RIBBONS

Dear Parishioners.

This year marks the 10th anniversary of the practice of tying ribbons to fences as a sign of support for people who have suffered child sexual abuse. This practice began in Ballarat during the Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse.

Over the past twelve months there have been discussions between members of the LOUD fence group and members of parish councils from St Patrick's Cathedral and St Alipius Ballarat East and these discussions have fostered mutual understanding about the ribbons. Such dialogue can also lead to an agreement about steps that we can take together, such as the agreement to tie ribbons to a particular section of the cathedral fence. A recent message from the LOUD fence group explained the ribbons in this way. "The Ribbons symbolise support for Survivors, their right to a voice for past harms and their visual reminder to those who care for children of their responsibility to prevent child sexual abuse." I realise that people have varied responses to the ribbons. However, I encourage you to look on the ribbons in a positive way, as a sign of support for survivors of abuse and as a reminder to the whole community of the need to do all we can to keep children safe.

I have been grateful for the dialogue between the LOUD fence group and representatives of parish councils and I endorse the agreements reached. When ribbons are placed on fences in line with such agreements, I ask that the ribbons be left in place as a mark of support for survivors and as a reminder to us all of our responsibility to make our communities safe places for everyone. #### Sent on a Mission of Peace

Reflection on the Gospel-Pentecost Sunday Year C (John 20:19-23)

Pentecost Sunday is sometimes called the birthday of the Church. For the ancient Israelites, Pentecost (meaning "fiftieth") was a harvest festival celebrated fifty days after the harvesting of the first sheaf. When the Jerusalem temple was built, this harvest festival was transformed into a pilgrimage feast to celebrate the covenant that Israel had made with God on Mt Sinai. The Jews of the first century, including Christian Jews, celebrated the great pilgrimage feast of Pentecost. Several decades after the death of Jesus, the early Christians reflected on their origins and chose this feast to mark the birth of God's new covenant with God's people.

In today's first reading (Acts 2:1-11), Luke tells the new Pentecost story in symbolic language that evokes the story of Moses and the people of Israel receiving God's Law on Mt. Sinai. Just as God's presence to Israel was marked by earthquake and thunder and fire, so God's Spirit enveloping the people of the new covenant appears in a mighty rush of wind and tongues of fire. Luke's account also evokes early rabbinic teaching that the voice of God on Sinai divided into seventy tongues and all the nations received the Law in their own tongues. In other words, the dispersion and division created by the hubris of those who built the Tower of Babel is symbolically reversed with this outpouring of God's Spirit.

For the content of the new covenant, we turn to the gospel reading from John 20:19-23. The risen Christ appears to the disciples huddled behind locked doors. He "shows them his hands and his side". In other words, he provides incontrovertible evidence that he is the crucified one. He offers the simple greeting: "Peace be with you," the greeting we offer each other at every Eucharistic celebration and the greeting of Pope Leo XIV on the day of his election. The disciples respond with joy. He sends them on a mission of peace in continuity with his own God-inspired mission. He breathes on them the gift of the Holy Spirit and tells them that God will forgive those whom they forgive, and will "retain" or "seize hold of" the transgressions of those whose transgressions they "retain".

To seize hold of evil-doing is to expose it and deal with it. Sometimes it is best to forgive and allow everyone to move on. In other situations, amnesty only exacerbates the problems. Much of the enduring conflict in our world derives from the inability of ordinary people and of leaders to know how to deal with transgression. The Holy Spirit is the unique source of our power to forgive, of our power to refrain from vengeance and of our capacity to deal with or "seize hold of" the sins of the perpetrators of violence in our world. Let us pray that the Spirit will guide us in the way of truth and give world leaders the courage to deal with the perpetrators of war and other evils in our world. We do our part by conscientiously holding our leaders to account.
