### In the Land of the Wadawurrung People

Dear families,

Recent media reports have highlighted serious concerns regarding child safety within the childcare sector. Distressing stories have emerged of individuals exploiting gaps in the system to harm vulnerable children. These incidents are deeply concerning and serve as a timely reminder of the importance of rigorous child safety standards in all educational settings.

At our school, child safety is not only a top priority—it is a non-negotiable foundation of everything we do. Teachers must be qualified and registered with the Victorian Institute of Teaching before they can be employed in our schools. This is reviewed annually. We do not employ staff who do not meet these essential standards.

All auxiliary staff members including learning support officers, administrative and maintenance staff, are required to hold a current and valid Working with Children Check. Moves to make this a national registry are certainly to be applauded and will add strength to this registry.

Our school is governed by the Diocese of Ballarat Catholic Education, Limited (DOBCEL) which oversees the governance of more than fifty schools in this region. DOBCEL is supported by the Victorian Registration and Qualifications Authority (VRQA), which oversees and audits our compliance with child safety requirements annually. We also ensure that all visiting tradespeople and parent volunteers provide the appropriate documentation before they are permitted to engage with students on site.

Additionally, every staff member undergoes annual training in child safety, helping us stay up to date with the latest best practices and legislative requirements. This training is recorded and monitored through an external provider to ensure consistency and accountability.

When planning camps, excursions, or any event involving student supervision, we take a

cautious and considered approach to staffing. Our goal is to ensure that both students and staff are fully supported and safe at all times.

We are proud of the measures we have in place and of the strong culture of care, responsibility, and vigilance that underpins our approach to child safety. The wellbeing of every student in our care is at the heart of everything we do. We are blessed to be able to work with your children each day and we take that responsibility very seriously.

### **Winter Uniform**

Please note that it is an expectation that correct winter uniform be worn at school each day. Sports uniform is permitted on sports days. Puffer jackets are not part of the uniform. Teachers will be monitoring uniform standards over the coming weeks so it might be timely to have a look at what the children are wearing to school each day.

### **Parking Near Staff Car Park**

It might be some old tracksuit pants and a windcheater or anything else that protects the school uniform on days when the ground may be wet, muddy or slippery. Cover-up clothing may include gumboots. The students who remember to bring along their cover-up clothing are really enjoying the paddock play areas and we encourage all students to join in the fun.

### THIS WEEK'S GOSPEL- Sunday July 27, 2025 Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year C)

### **Gospel:** Luke 11:1-13

One day Jesus was praying in a certain place. When he had finished, one of his disciples said to him, "Lord, teach us to pray, just as John taught his disciples."

Jesus said to them, "When you pray, say this: 'Father: May your holy name be honoured; may your Kingdom come. Give us this day the food we need. Forgive us our sins, for we forgive everyone who does us wrong. And do not bring us to hard testing." (Gospel passage taken from Good News Translation)

### **Gospel reflection**

The disciples ask Jesus to teach them how to pray and Jesus gives the disciples a prayer that they can use. This prayer is often called the "Lord's Prayer", because it is the prayer that Jesus taught us. With slightly different words, we still pray this prayer today. It is a prayer that we say every time we come to Mass. In our NAIDOC Mass on Friday, we sang the Aboriginal Our Father. The lyrics are as follows:

You are our Father, you live in heaven,

We talk to you. Father you are good.

We believe your word, Father,

We are your children, give us bread today.

We have done wrong, we are sorry,

Teach us, Father, all about your Word.

Others have done wrong to us,

And we are sorry for them, Father, today.

Stop us from doing wrong, Father,

Save us all from the evil one.

You are our Father, you live in heaven,

We talk to you, Father, you are good.

**Our Challenge:** How will you do what is right this week? How will you help make sure that all people have their fair share of the daily bread that God gives to us?

A special thank you to our Parish Priest Fr Justin Driscoll, who celebrated with us and spoke to us

about the importance of listening, with children offering their thoughts about respect, hospitality and reconciliation. Congratulations to all the students who participated in our rituals, prayer and songs- their respectful and reverent behaviour was noted by staff and parents alike.

Many thanks also to family members, friends and community members who joined us for our Eucharist- we love it when you join our school family to celebrate together.

It's a special year, marking the 80th anniversary of Children's Book Week.

### **NAPLAN 2025**

Individual student reports from ACARA (Australian Curriculum, Assessment and Reporting Authority) will be sent home via mail on Wednesday, 30 July. If you haven't received your report by Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup> August, please contact the office.

These reports provide the results from the national assessments (NAPLAN) that students in Years 3 and 5 completed in Term 1.



As part of our ongoing assessment schedule, all children at SFX will participate in reading assessments over the next two weeks. We use DIBELS (Dynamic Indicators of Basic Early Literacy Skills), a research-based tool that helps monitor the development of essential reading skills.

DIBELS assessments are conducted one-on-one and are quick to administer. They focus on key areas such as phonemic awareness, reading fluency, and comprehension. The data collected supports teachers in identifying students who may need additional support and helps track progress throughout the year. The aim is to ensure every child is developing the skills they need to become confident, capable readers.

Child Safe Standard 4: Families and communities are informed and involved in promoting child safety and wellbeing.

Sibling Relationships



Sibling relationships are often a child's first and longest-lasting social connection. These bonds can offer companionship, support and opportunities to develop important life skills such as empathy, negotiation and conflict resolution. However, like all close relationships, sibling dynamics can be complex. Differences in temperament, age, needs and parental attention can all contribute to tension or rivalry. It's not uncommon for children to compete for attention, especially during times of change or stress.

As a parent or caregiver, your role in shaping the tone of sibling relationships is vital. Creating a home environment that celebrates each child's unique strengths and avoids direct comparisons helps reduce rivalry and fosters mutual respect.

By listening without judgement, teaching emotional regulation, and supporting each child's individuality, you can create a family culture where siblings feel secure and valued. This edition of SchoolTV offers insights to support young people in developing positive, lasting sibling bonds that can remain strong well into adulthood.



### Three Little Cameos on Prayer

Reflection on the Gospel-17<sup>th</sup> Sunday on Ordinary Time C (Luke 11:1-13) Veronica M. Lawson RSM

This Sunday's gospel offers three little cameos about praying and about God's generous giving. There are two teachings on prayer forming a frame around an enigmatic parable. In the first cameo, Jesus has finished praying and one of the disciples asks him to teach them to pray. Jesus responds as any devout first century Jew might respond. He evokes the words of the Jewish blessing prayer: "May the great name of God be exalted and sanctified, throughout the world. May God's kingship be established in your lifetime." Jesus calls God "father", a metaphor or image denoting the power of God over against the potentially destructive power of the Roman emperor.

The prayer continues with an acknowledgement that bread, fruit of the earth, is the gift of God: "Keep giving us each day the bread we need." This is not a prayer for more than we need, but for just as much as we need. The final petitions in the prayer that Jesus teaches are for forgiveness of sin "as we forgive each who is in debt to us" and for freedom from testing. We cannot live without "bread" just as we cannot live without the peace of mind that comes from forgiveness and from the knowledge that God is with us in times of trial such as the present global crisis with all its demands for radical change.

The parable that follows has raised questions for interpreters. Is this parable about persistence or about avoidance of shame? These are two very different concepts, but both have been suggested as the motive for the sleeping neighbour's response to the friend in need and as the proper rendering of the Greek word anaideia.

### THIS WEEK'S READINGS

Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time Genesis: 18:20-32 Colossians: 2:12-14 Luke: 11: 1-13



The literal meaning of anaideia is avoidance of shame. Avoidance of shame makes sense in a culture where one would be shamed by refusal to help a neighbour who is unable to meet the demands of hospitality, especially where one could well find oneself in similar need some time. No one would dream of refusing such a request for help, whether for the sake of friendship or to avoid being shamed, not even those who let it be known that they resent having to get out of bed in the middle of the night.

Persistence in prayer is a desirable quality but it has nothing to do with the parable of the friend in need who asks only once for "three loaves" and can expect to receive them. The translation "persistence" seems to derive from association with the repetition of seeking and searching and knocking, in other words with the sayings that form the third little cameo. Finally, Jesus draws on the experience of his listeners: if flawed disciples know how to give "good gifts" to their children, then they should not be surprised that those who ask for the Holy Spirit will receive this best of all gifts from God as they seek to renew the face of God's depleted and troubled Earth.
