This "local contribution factor" comes from school fees, levies, and fundraising.

Thanks to the generous support of our families, we not only meet our core costs but also provide valuable extras that enhance your child's school experience. For example, last year's fundraising efforts allowed us to completely replace the adventure playground and install new shade sails—wonderful improvements that benefit every student.

Our Parents & Friends Committee works tirelessly throughout the year, with meetings that are full of energy, ideas and commitment. All parents are warmly welcome to attend—there is always room at the table.

Our community is strong and vibrant because of the dedication and generosity of our families. Thank you for everything you do. And if you can join us at the Trivia Night, we'd love to see you there!

Boite Schools Chorus 2025

The SFX Choir was proud to join with other local schools in this year's Boite Schools Chorus, a statewide choral project that celebrates culture and community through song. Each year, the Chorus highlights a different cultural theme, and in 2025 the focus was on Timor-Leste, marking 50 years since the first Timorese refugees arrived in Australia.

Through *Mai Fali Eh!* (which means "Come Back Home"), students and the audience shared in the rich stories, language, and traditions of Timor-Leste. Songs were performed in both English and Tetum, the official language of Timor-Leste, including the song, 'The Boy and the Crocodile' - a foundation myth about kindness and the creation of East Timor.

The performance at Mt Clear Secondary College brought together choirs from across Ballarat under the direction of Stella Savvy and accompanied by the incredible talents of Paulo Almeida, Gil Santos, and José Mesquite from the *Mystic Trio*. Our SFX students performed with confidence and energy, captivating the audience with their singing and stage presence. A heartfelt thank you to Hattie Frdelja and Dan West for preparing and guiding our students so well for this special event.

Events like the Boite Schools Chorus remind us of the power of music to celebrate diversity, build understanding, and strengthen community connections.

Religious Education News

THIS WEEK'S GOSPEL- Sunday September 7, 2025 Twenty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year C)

Gospel: Luke 14:25-33 Once when large crowds of people were going along with Jesus, he turned and said to them, "Those who come to me cannot be my disciples unless they love me more than they love father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, and themselves as well. Those who do not carry their own cross and come after me cannot be my disciples.

"If one of you is planning to build a tower, you sit down first and work out what it will cost, to see if you have enough money to finish the job. If you don't you will not be able to finish the tower after laying the foundation; and all who see what happened will laugh at you. 'This man began to build but can't finish the job!' they will say.

"If a king goes out with 10,000 men to fight another king who comes against him with 20,000 men, he will sit down first and decide if he is strong enough to face that other king. If he isn't, he will send messengers to meet the other king, to ask for terms of peace while he is still a long way off. In the same way," concluded Jesus, "none of you can be my disciple unless you give up everything you have." (Gospel passage taken from Good News Translation)

Gospel reflection

Jesus tells the crowds two short stories to explain what being a disciple means, and to show us that if we want to follow him we must be committed. We must also "carry our cross" which means accepting the things we find difficult in our lives and asking for God's help in these difficult things.

Both stories tell us about how important it is not to rush straight into something without thinking about it first. We need to prepare so that we can see our project through to the finish. It needs to be done properly. Jesus is telling us that following him and being a disciple is something that we have to see through to the finish. This isn't always easy-often we can be distracted by other people or by thinking about what we want rather than about what Jesus wants for us. Throughout our lives as followers of Jesus, we might have to choose to do what Jesus wants even if it means not always being popular. It is hard but God is with us all the way to help and guide us.

Our Challenge: How will you follow Jesus this week at home or in school? See if you can try to do one thing to show that you follow him, and finish it, even if it is difficult. What will that be? (Adapted from CAFOD website)

What wonderful adventures we had showing our Dads and Special Friends around our school - the smiles on everyone's faces said it all!


Child Protection Week at St Francis Xavier

BRAVEHEARTS VISIT

On **Tuesday September 9th**, the children in Foundation, Year One and Year Two have the opportunity to experience Bravehearts' personal safety education program Ditto's Keep Safe Adventure Show. The Ditto show is a live, interactive 40 minute performance starring Bravehearts' mascot 'Ditto'. It includes song, dance, and easy-to-remember messages about personal safety.

The show is underpinned by the following six principles of personal safety:

- Differentiating 'yes' and 'no' feelings
- Recognising the bodies 'warning signs'
- Identifying 'private parts' and 'privacy'
- Helping children identify language and feelings associated with secrets
- Reinforcing that there is no secret that children cannot tell someone

Special Report: R U OK?Day

Understanding the growing challenges related to mental health among young people is an important consideration. Anxiety, depression and self-harm - are all causes for concern. Factors like academic pressure, social media, family dynamics and social expectations, are contributing to these issues. It's therefore crucial for parents and caregivers to take action early, remove the stigma around discussing mental health, and offer accessible support to address these issues and the wellbeing of their children.

R U OK?Day is an initiative that focuses on preventing suicide by encouraging meaningful personal connections and helping informal support networks to help recognise the signs of distress. We urge all families to take part, emphasising the value of genuine human relationships and reminding everyone to ask the important question, "Are you OK?"

Engaging in R U OK?Day activities go beyond the classroom; it's a commitment to our students' overall development. By talking openly about mental health, schools create safe spaces where students feel understood, valued, and supported. As parents and caregivers, you can contribute by fostering open conversations, normalising feelings and breaking down mental health stigmas. Participating in R U OK?Day promotes compassion and shows our dedication to the wellbeing of the entire school community, reaffirming that together, we can truly make a difference.

This Special Report provides guidance on how to talk to your child about mental health and engage in meaningful discussions.

The webinar will include an overview from Bishop Paul Bird CSsR and presentations from James Treloar, Senior Manager in Homelessness and Housing Support at CatholicCare Victoria, Michael Ryan, OAM, President of the Ballarat region of the St Vincent de Paul Society and Maria Noonan, CEO of St John of God Hospital Ballarat and Warrnambool. SEASON OF CREATION

Each year from September 1 - October 4, the Christian family unites for this worldwide celebration of prayer and action to protect our common home. It is a special season where we celebrate God as Creator and acknowledge Creation as the divine continuing act that summons us as collaborators to love and care for the gift of all that is created. As followers of Christ from around the globe, we share a common call to care for Creation. We are co-creatures and part of all that God has made. Our well-being is interwoven with the well-being of the Earth. We rejoice in this opportunity to safeguard our common home and all beings who share it. This year, the theme for the season is "Peace with Creation."

"Leaving Aside" for the Sake of True Peace

Reflection on the Gospel-23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time C

(Luke 14:25-33) Veronica Lawson RSM

As we continue to join with Christians across the globe in celebrating the Season of Creation (September 1-October 4), we might attend to the 2025 theme, "Peace with Creation" and the symbol for this year, "Garden of Peace". The theme is inspired by the words of the prophet Isaiah (32:14-18) who proclaims that justice brings peace: peace for God's Earth, peace for God's people. We might renew our commitment to the gospel call to care and to enact justice for all that constitutes our common home.

In today's gospel reading, we are confronted with the pain involved in living a way of life that respects the rights of all created beings. On the long journey from Galilee through Samaritan territory to the city of Jerusalem, Jesus attracts a huge following and teaches relentlessly about the ways of God. By the time he reaches Jerusalem, the crowds have thinned considerably. Is this because it is too hard to persist with their initial impulse to follow the way of the gospel and the one who embodies its values? Implicit in Jesus' teaching about carrying one's cross is a reminder of the intense pain and sacrifice involved in being a disciple. It sometimes means going against what other family members want. It may even involve risking one's life for the sake of life. In the context of the Roman Empire, criminals who were sentenced to die by crucifixion carried to the place of their execution the cross beam on which they would hang. The cross image is shocking for anyone. It is quite alienating for the faint hearted.

The term "hate" (misein) in this context seems harsh. The English translation fails to do justice, however, to the original Greek or to the Hebrew (sone) that underlies this notion. To "hate" in biblical terms is to "leave aside". Disciples are expected to love one another. There are times, however, when they have to "leave aside" the wishes of those they love most for the sake of a gospel call to justice, compassion, and right relationship. If we are attentive to the gender bias of this ancient text, we might note that married men are addressed while married women are not. Here as elsewhere, women have to read against the grain of the text in order to hear its message.

Finally, there is a call in this gospel passage to "leave aside" unnecessary possessions. In this time of planetary vulnerability and of growing division between the privileged and the marginalised of the Earth community, the teaching of the Lukan Jesus has a particular resonance. There is no place in a gospel way of life for self-indulgence, for exploitation of others or for self-centred appropriation of the goods of the earth. Hearing the voice of creation implies systemic change so that the needs of all the creatures of the earth might be met within the means of the earth to provide.


