Dear families,

Once again, our school was the target of unwelcome visitors last week. Copper wiring was stolen from our grounds, and, once again, learning was interrupted for our children. It's hard to believe that lightning can strike twice in the same place, and yet it can. Desperate individuals, with just enough knowledge to access the pits and remove what they wanted, caused significant damage to our school.

Of course, we will recover—and in fact, we already have. Yet the feelings of intrusion and violation remain strong. Our amazing service providers have worked tirelessly to restore power and repair the damage, and we are extremely grateful for their hard work and commitment to our school.

When we discovered the damage early Tuesday morning, we had to act quickly. We knew families would already be on their way to school or preparing to drop children off. A message was sent out immediately, and as always, our parent community rallied to support us in our time of need. Your flexibility and understanding, even with such short notice, were deeply appreciated. Those children who remained at school embraced a different type of day and were wonderfully accepting of the changes that had to be made. Our staff, as always, provided exceptional care for all students, and I am very proud of their efforts.

Where to from here? That's a good question. We are currently exploring additional security measures around the school, which you may notice in the coming weeks. Fortunately, our CCTV system captured valuable information that has been shared with police. New vandal-proof pit covers are in place, and we remain hopeful that we won't have to experience this type of incident again.

THIS WEEK'S GOSPEL- Sunday November 2, 2025 All Saints (Year C)

Gospel: Matthew 5:1-12

Jesus saw the crowds and went up a hill, where he sat down. His disciples gathered round him, and he began to teach them:

"Happy are those who know they are spiritually poor; the Kingdom of heaven belongs to them!

"Happy are those who mourn; God will comfort them!

"Happy are those who are humble; they will receive what God has promised!

"Happy are those whose greatest desire is to do what God requires; God will satisfy them fully!

"Happy are those who are merciful to others; God will be merciful to them!

"Happy are the pure in heart; they will see God!

"Happy are those who work for peace; God will call them his children!

"Happy are those who are persecuted because they do what God requires; the Kingdom of heaven belongs to them! "Happy are you when people insult you and persecute you and tell all kinds of evil lies against you because you are my followers. Be happy and glad, for a great reward is kept for you in heaven. This is how the prophets who lived before you were persecuted." (Gospel passage taken from Good News Translation)

Our Challenge: Perhaps this week we can try particularly hard to remember what it is that Jesus asks of us. Perhaps you could choose to try and be one of the types of people that Jesus says will be happy this week: gentle and humble, merciful, peaceful, doing what is right. Perhaps you could show special care to those who are sad, laughed at, hurt or poor.

Teaching and Learning Update



PASTORAL LETTER TO THE CATHOLICS OF VICTORIA ON EUTHANASIA AND ASSISTED

The State Government is seeking to amend Victoria's euthanasia and assisted suicide laws. If passed, the Government's Bill would further weaken protections for vulnerable patients and reduce protections for medical practitioners who conscientiously object to euthanasia and assisted suicide. In response the Bishops of Victoria have written a pastoral letter to asking that we contact our local Members of Parliament to urge them to vote against the proposed laws. Destined to Share the Fullness of Life

Reflection on the Gospel- All Souls Day (Luke 7:11-17) Veronica Lawson RSM

All Souls Day is a time to remember those who have died, especially the members of our family and those close to us. It follows immediately on the Solemnity of All Saints. Over these two days, we celebrate the mystery of the communion of saints: the saints through whom we pray to God, the saints for whom we pray, and the saints (God's "holy" people) with whom we gather to pray. All Souls Day was first celebrated by monks in the seventh century, on the day after Pentecost. Since the tenth century, it has been observed on November 2. Prayer for the dead is grounded in a deep conviction that a purifying process accompanies the experience of death. Some suggest that at death we face the personal limitations we have not faced in life. Who knows? It remains in the realm of mystery.

In today's gospel reading, Jesus encounters a funeral cortege at the gates of Nain. He is moved with compassion (esplanchnisthē), moved at the very core of his being, for the plight of a woman who is shattered by the death of her only son and under threat of a life of destitution. In first century Palestine, women who lacked the protection of a husband or adult son were among the most destitute. The unnamed woman of our story has already suffered the loss of her husband. She now grieves for the loss of her adult son who is identified as a "young man".

THIS WEEK'S READINGS

The Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed
2 Maccabees: 12:43-45
Romans: 5:17-21
Gospel: Luke: 7:11-17

For a widow to lose her only son was shattering. She became dependent upon the goodwill of neighbours and friends and whatever extended family she may have had. Nain was a tiny village in the Valley of Jezreel in the southern part of Galilee. As in every town, the gate was the place where legal cases were determined and justice was delivered. Now, at the gate of this town, Jesus of Nazareth brings both mercy and justice. He feels the pain of the widow and responds by restoring life, not only to the young man, but to his mother, to the extended family and to the grieving village community.

Like this young man, Jesus was the only son of a woman who had possibly been widowed by the time he began his public ministry. His mother is to know the same pain of loss as her unnamed "sister" in Nain. The sight of the funeral procession and the tears of the woman elicit his heart-felt compassion. Tears will function later in this chapter as an instrument of hospitality (7:36-50). In this story, the tears and touch of the Anointed of God bring life to a son who was lost and restore life to a community and family within that community. In the context of today's celebration, the young man's restoration to earthly life might function to remind us that death does not have the last word, that we are ultimately destined to share the fullness of life with God, the source of life.
