Dear families,

In just four weeks, our federal government will introduce new legislation restricting social media access for children under 16 years of age. This represents a significant step forward in the area of cyber safety and is being closely watched by many other countries.

The new restrictions are designed to protect children from the pressures and risks associated with social media use. These risks often stem from design features that encourage excessive screen time and expose young users to content that can impact their health and wellbeing. It's important to note that online gaming and standalone messaging apps are excluded from the new rules. However, messaging services that include social-media-style features—such as content sharing or public interaction—may fall under the new age restrictions, as will messaging features accessed through age-restricted social media platforms.

As someone who occasionally encounters the darker side of social media, I am very aware of the impact it can have on young people. As an educator, I've seen firsthand the effects of overexposure to screens; and as a parent, I understand how central technology has become in all our lives. I'm hopeful that these new regulations will help address these challenges and

provide parents with greater support as we navigate this evolving space together.

With the new laws taking effect on December 10, now may be a good time to start preparing and having those important family discussions.

Religious Education News

THIS WEEK'S GOSPEL- Sunday November 9, 2025 The Dedication of the Lateran Basilica (Year C) Gospel: John 2:13-22

It was almost time for the Passover Festival, so Jesus went to Jerusalem. There in the Temple he found people selling cattle, sheep, and pigeons, and also the moneychangers sitting at their tables. So he made a whip from cords and drove all the animals out of the Temple, both the sheep and the cattle; he overturned the tables of the money changers and scattered their coins; and he ordered those who sold the pigeons, "Take them out of here! Stop making my Father's house a marketplace!" His disciples remembered that the scripture says, "My devotion to your house, O God, burns in me like a fire."

The Jewish authorities came back at him with a question, "What miracle can you perform to show us that you have the right to do this? Jesus answered, "Tear down this Temple, and in three days I will build it again." "Are you going to build it again in three days?" they asked him. "It has taken forty-six years to build this Temple!" But the temple Jesus was speaking about was his body. So when he was raised from death his disciples remembered that he had said this, and they believed the scripture and what Jesus had said. (Gospel passage taken from Good News Translation®)

Gospel reflection: The temple was the highly symbolic place where civil and religious power melded into one. Jesus targets a central part of the corruption, the exploitation of pilgrims of their hard earned money. It was the poor who were being exploited through the sale of sacrificial doves and other animals, which by law they were obliged to buy. Those getting the payoff included the High Priest and his entourage, who in addition to any profits accrued, received taxes from vendors and money-changers. Jesus drove the traders all out of the Temple because he saw the meaning of the Temple as a holy sanctuary had been lost for ordinary people due to the greed of the traders and the ruling caste running the Temple. Jesus was standing up for what he believed in. He saw something that he did not think was fair or right and so he acted to change the situation. Just like Jesus stood up for what was right, we are called to do the same.

Our Challenge: What do you do when you see something that you know is wrong or unfair? What can you do to change things that you know are unfair? (Adapted from CAFOD website and Jim Consedine "Driving Out the Money Changers" 2009)



We Cannot Live without Beauty or the Symbolic in our Lives

Reflection on the Gospel- Dedication of the Lateran Basilica (John 2:13-22) Veronica Lawson RSM

My mother once told us (her children) never to replicate a mistake that she had made when she was first married. She received an unexpected £2000 bequest from a relative and found herself confronted with a choice between purchasing furniture for the house my dad had just built and investing in a Dobell painting that had come on the market. After a good deal of soul-searching, she opted for the furniture. Reflecting on this decision many years later, she told us: "You can sit on kerosene tins or wooden cartons. but you cannot live without beauty or the symbolic in your life. Never make the mistake that I made." That advice comes to mind again as I consider today's feast and as I reflect on those who, over the ages, have taken to heart the message of the prophet Haggai and have attended to the building of God's house of worship. Why celebrate the dedication of a church? Why does this feast override the sequence of Sundays in Ordinary Time? Why is it so important? It is not so much a question of the beauty of the Church of St John Lateran in Rome that makes it so important. It rather has to do with what this particular church signifies for Christians. The first Lateran Basilica was built in the time of the Emperor Constantine. Many of the Church Councils from the seventh century to the sixteenth century were held there. It was known as the "mother and head of all the churches of the city (Rome) and of the world." It is the Pope's church and the basilica of Rome. As such, it has functioned as a sign of unity for all Christians from the fourth century of the common era and has the potential to function in this way for all Catholic Christians in our times.




The Dedication of the Lateran Basilica Ezekiel: 47:1-2, 8-9,12 1 Corinthians: 3:9-11, 16-17 Gospel: John: 2:13-22



The selection from John's gospel presents Jesus driving the money-changers and the merchants from the Temple precinct in Jerusalem. These people had a legitimate function there, but some were more interested in financial gain than in respect for the Temple as God's dwelling place and as a locus of worship. Jesus affirms the Temple as God's 'house'. He goes on to speak of the temple of his body that God will "raise up" after three days. The gospel is thus a subtle reminder that the building is God's house only if our lives are congruent with what the building signifies. In Paul's theology, the church and its members are "God's building". The term "church" has come to designate both the architectural edifice and the believers who assemble for worship. Beautiful church buildings play a crucial role in raising our hearts and minds to God and in leading us to deep respect for all of God's creation. That is most certainly true of my regular place of worship, the Church of Saints Peter and Paul in Buninyong, Victoria. My mother was right about the power of the symbolic.



Kinship care is about:

- Ensuring Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children and young people have a positive and nurturing family life experience that will support their cultural, social and emotional development.
- Providing a culturally safe home for children who cannot live with their birth families.
- Maintaining the child or young person's connections with their families and communities.
 Recognising and maintains.
- Recognising and maintaining the child or young person's Aboriginal identity and place in the community.

Families come in all shapes and sizes; large families, couples and single adults can all offer something different to meet the needs of specific children. We currently need Kinship carers for all types of care; long-term, short-term and respite, and want to work with you to discover what would best suit your circumstances.

There is immediate and ongoing financial support available for all placements to ensure that caring for children does not have a negative financial impact on your family.
