Moving Up Day



Feast Day of St. Francis Xavier

The feast day of our Patron, St Francis Xavier, will be celebrated on Wednesday 3 December. St Francis Xavier was a remarkable man, born in Spain in 1506 and passing away in 1552. He became the first Christian and the first Jesuit missionary to reach Japan — a nation that, in the sixteenth century, was largely closed to the outside world and little understood by Europeans.

His missionary journeys extended far beyond Japan. St Francis Xavier travelled to Borneo, India, Ceylon (now Sri Lanka), Mozambique and several other regions that had not yet encountered Christian missionaries. He also worked alongside a small pioneering group of Jesuits in China, striving to share the Gospel and build connections with local communities.

The courage, faith and determination of St Francis Xavier continue to inspire us today, reminding us to be strong in our beliefs and to share God's love through our words and actions.

THIS WEEK'S GOSPEL- November 30, 2025 First Sunday of Advent (Year A)

Gospel: Matthew 24: 37- 44 'So stay awake, because you do not know the day when your master is coming. You may be quite sure of this that if the householder had known at what time of the night the burglar would come, he would have stayed awake and would not have allowed anyone to break through the wall of his house. Therefore, you too must stand ready because the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect.'

(Gospel passage taken from Good News Translation)

Gospel reflection: As we begin our time of Advent this week (Advent is a word from Latin that means "coming"), we are reminded that we must be ready. We prepare ourselves for the birth of Jesus on Christmas day. Child Safe Standard 7: Processes for complaints and concerns are child-focused.

When things are perceived to be hard, the lure to quit can be very big.

Challenge your negative thoughts

Socratic questioning is the process of challenging and changing irrational thoughts. Studies show that this method can reduce depression symptoms. The goal is to get you from a negative mindset ("I'm a failure") to a more positive one ("I've had a lot of success in my career. This is just one setback that doesn't reflect on me. I can learn from it and be better."). Here are some examples of questions you can ask yourself or your child to challenge negative thinking.

Firstly, write down your negative thoughts, such as "I'm having problems at work and am questioning my abilities."

- Then ask yourself: "What is the evidence for this thought?"
- "Am I basing this on facts? Or feelings?"
- "Could I be misinterpreting the situation?"
- "How might other people view the situation differently?"
- "How might I view this situation if it happened to someone else?"

So when your child comes home after a tough day at school, a bad play or a large loss, remind them: It's alright to quit. Quitting will forever be a choice, but not on an awful day. In my own family growing up we always had a rule that once you commit to a group, club or a period of activity, you need to maintain your end of the deal and complete what you began.

VINNIES CHRISTMAS APPEAL

The cost-of-living crisis has reached a worrying new low. 3.3 million people in Australia are currently living in poverty (that's more than 1 in 8). VENERABLE MARY OF THE SACRED HEART GLOWREY

Pope Leo XIV has formally recognised the heroic virtues of the Servant of God Dr Sr Mary Glowrey JMJ, daughter of Victoria and missionary doctor in India. As of 21 November 2025, she now bears the title of Venerable Mary of the Sacred Heart Glowrey. This significant step in her cause for canonisation makes her only the second Australian, after St Mary of the Cross MacKillop, to be accorded this honour. Born in the Victorian town of Birregurra in 1887, Glowrey was an experienced doctor in Melbourne hospitals and private practice when she travelled to India, aged 32, and entered religious life in Guntur, located in present day Andhra Pradesh. Invited to Find Life in Our Living

Reflection on the Gospel-1st Sunday of Advent Year A

(Matthew 24:37-44) Veronica Lawson RSM


"Where is the Life we have lost in living?" asks the Chorus in T. S. Eliot's The Rock. The Jesus of Matthew's gospel is implicitly asking the same question as Eliot's Chorus. He is making much the same observation as Henry David Thoreau, "Most [people] lead lives of quiet desperation and go to the grave with the song still in them." We are invited to find Life in our living and to sing the songs that are in us. We are to be agents of our own future rather than unthinking participants in the destruction of our planet. Right now, the human community is challenged in unprecedented ways to restore the life we have lost by living beyond our means and by destructively exploiting the riches of the Earth.

As we begin a new liturgical year, Matthew's Jesus invites us to contemplate the ultimate realities even as we attend to the demands of the present, a "present" where over twenty per cent of the world's human community are homeless and where land-clearing has decimated the other-than-human life of the planet. The Matthean Jesus tells us to be "awake", to be "ready" all the time, not because death or the end of the world are around the corner, but because we need to recognise the multiple "advents" or arrivals of the Christ, the Human One, who calls us beyond selfabsorption to Life. He offers a reminder that we are no different from our forebears who from earliest days have gone about their daily business without being sufficiently attentive to what really matters.

In our times, we have allowed thieves to break in and plunder our planet, our common home, because thieves come in guises that we fail to recognise. They so often look just like us and do the things we do.

It may be that we must first be attentive to our own ways of plundering the house that is home to all of God's creatures. We spend much of our time looking back. That has its place, since our history informs our present and helps us in shaping our future, though all the while we know with Auden that '[t]he past is foreign country: they do things differently there'. Advent invites us to look forward rather than back and to dream gospel-inspired dreams that will enable creative change in our own lives and in the life of our planet. It invites us to be awake, to be ready for any eventuality.

Dreams and visions have always been the precursors to effective and life-effecting change. We need the grace to see visions and to dream dreams that make for justice and peace and that permit us to walk more freely in the light of God's ways. We seek the grace to "see" God's word as did the prophet Isaiah in the first reading (Isaiah 2:1-5). We need to put our energy into creating life-generating systems that enable us to move forward in the paths of gospel compassion and love.
