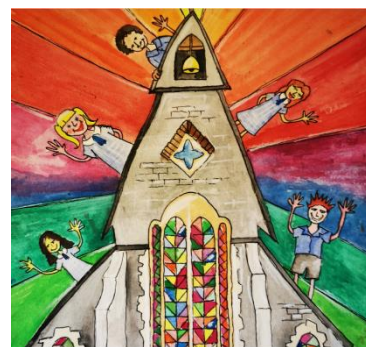

Please be mindful when approaching the school by car. We will publish more information about how to manage traffic conditions in next week's newsletter but if we can all be mindful of the road laws that will help everyone especially at busy times.

A Busy School

While we were enjoying our summer break Mr. Houlihan and our maintenance team has been very busy working behind the scenes to ensure that valuable maintenance is carried out in and around our school. Some of the tasks undertaken include a Sprinkler system installed in the top oval. Scaffolding erected to install new fascia, guttering, down pipes and paint to the rear facade of the art room. The art room was stripped back, and repainted and new doors fitted. New glass petition/wall installed in middle school building to create new office space. New handles placed onto cupboard doors and old ones patched and painted in LSO room. Installation of the infrastructure for a security access gate to the staff car park with a new electrical sliding gate to be completed in coming weeks. The music room has been painted and has been fitted with new sound absorbing carpet tiles. Soft-fall topped up on the playground. Clean up around lower oval, bush play area and school grounds. CLOSURE on a Day of CATASTROPHIC Fire Danger Rating

Please be aware that our school will always be closed on a day that has been declared as Catastrophic fire danger rating day in our Fire Weather District. This is a result of being listed on the Victorian Government's Bushfire at Risk Register (BARR). A Catastrophic fire day will be officially confirmed by the CFA on the afternoon of the day before. Once we are advised of the confirmation of the Catastrophic fire danger rating day we will provide that confirmation to you as soon as we can after that.

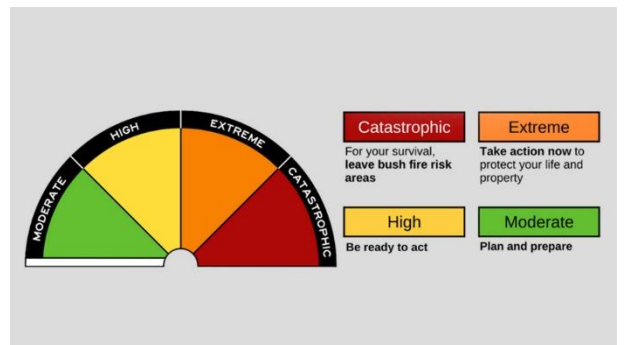
Once confirmed, the decision to close will not change, regardless of improvements in the weather forecast. This is to avoid confusion and help your family plan alternative care arrangements for your child. It is also important to note that:

- ✓ No staff will be on site on days where the school is closed due to a forecast Catastrophic fire day.
- ✓ School camps will be cancelled if a Catastrophic fire danger rating day is determined for the Fire Weather District in which the camp is located.
- ✓ All bus routes in the warning area should be assumed to be cancelled.

On these Catastrophic fire days families are encouraged to enact their Bushfire Survival Plan – on such days children should never be left at home or in the care of older children. As part of preparing our school for potential hazards such as fire, we have completed our Emergency Management Plan, [reprioritised any maintenance works that may assist in preparing for the threat of fire and cleared our facility's grounds and gutters].

What can parents do?

1. Make sure your family's bushfire survival plan is up-to-date and includes alternative care arrangements in the event that our school is closed.
2. Ensure we have your current contact details, including your mobile phone numbers. Keep in touch with us by reading our newsletters, by checking our website <https://www.sfxballarat.catholic.edu.au/> and by talking to your child's teacher or any other member of the teaching staff about our emergency management plan.
3. If your child is old enough, talk to them about bushfires and your family's bushfire survival plan.

Over the coming weeks, teachers will start beginning-of-year assessments in English and Mathematics. These assessments help teachers understand each student's strengths and learning needs and inform planning/teaching for the year ahead.



Year Ahead Meetings – Years 1–6

We are pleased to share a new, streamlined format for our Year Ahead Meetings. These meetings will be held **on one afternoon ONLY Tuesday 10 February (Week 3)** and are designed to provide flexibility for families and so that families with more than one child can attend ALL Year Ahead meetings on the one night. .

Sessions will run for **25 minutes**, repeated four times in the afternoon, allowing families to attend all relevant year-level and specialist sessions on the same day.

Families can plan the sessions that best suit their needs and move between sessions as required. This structure ensures consistent information is shared while offering flexibility and choice.

Please note Foundation families are not required to participate in these as they have their own structure for testing and sharing information.

Purpose of Year Ahead Meetings Year Ahead Meetings provide Parents and Carers with key information about teachers, learning programs and classroom organisation. They support strong partnerships between home and school and help establish shared expectations for the year ahead.

The meetings aim to help families:

- Understand what their child is learning and doing in class
- Recognise what successful learning looks like
- Promote high standards for student work
- Gain practical ways to support learning at home
- Understand how student progress is supported and monitored
- Meet their child's teacher(s)

We look forward to working in partnership with you throughout the year.

WEEKLY WELLBEING

Welcome to the 2026 School Year!

What a joy it has been each morning to feel such positive energy and to see our children so excited about another year of learning!

I would like to extend a warm introduction to new families in my role as School Counsellor and Mental Health in Primary Schools Wellbeing Leader. Throughout the year, I will contribute regular newsletter articles focused on strengthening families and supporting wellbeing, as a way of partnering with you in your very important role as parents and caregivers. Let me know if there is a particular topic or area you would like me to focus upon!

At St Francis Xavier, student wellbeing and mental health are central to our commitment to holistic education. We are fortunate to be part of the Mental Health in Primary Schools (MHIPS) initiative which strengthens our whole-school approach to mental health promotion, early intervention and targeted support. This framework allows us to continue building a school environment where every child feels safe, supported and able to thrive.

I have always been thrilled by the way wellbeing has been embraced by our community, especially by the children I work with. Many referrals come through children speaking with friends, parents connecting with other parents or teachers recognising when a child may benefit from extra support — a wonderful sign that wellbeing is truly a shared priority in our school and that seeking support is a positive and proactive step.

We are excited to introduce several new wellbeing initiatives in 2026. Our Year 4-6 students have received their new Read and Thrive journals- these are for recording their homework, using it as a reading log and highlighting events in our school calendar. These journals are designed to support student wellbeing through simple, practical activities focused on mindfulness, self-care and emotional awareness. By focusing upon the use of consistent mental health and wellbeing language, students become more familiar with words and concepts that help them understand their feelings, describe their experiences and seek support when needed. Building this shared language across school and home helps create a common understanding of wellbeing and supports more confident, open conversations. I like to think we are highlighting that wellbeing is as important to us as academic success! We are also implementing Linewise PULSE, a weekly wellbeing check-in program for students in Years 3–6 later this term- I'll share more about this later.

Alongside the continuation of our Student Wellbeing Leaders, who play an important role in representing student voice, we will be inviting expressions of interest from members of our school community to participate in small wellbeing focus groups. These groups will provide an opportunity to explore specific topics, share perspectives and collaborate with the school in shaping our wellbeing priorities and programs. Let me know if you are keen to be involved- everyone is welcome!

What an exciting year we have ahead! I look forward to working together to ensure a positive, supportive and inclusive year for all members of our school community.

A Message of Hope for a Troubled World

Reflection on the Gospel

4th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year A

(Matthew 5:1-12)

We have become so familiar with Matthew's beatitudes that there is a danger of our listening only to the mellifluous flow of language and of failing to attend to the extraordinary present and future reversal that they offer to those who suffer injustice and to those who choose non-violent ways of addressing the pain of our world. With the escalation of violence across the globe and with powerful leaders opting for military rather than diplomatic solutions to global conflicts or threats, it is time to listen anew to these opening words of Jesus' "Sermon on the Mount".

The mountain setting establishes Jesus as wisdom teacher like Moses of old. God's favour rests on the poor, on the gentle, on those who grieve for the pain of the world, on serious justice seekers, on those who know what it means to mercy, on the pure in heart, on peacemakers, and on those who suffer in the cause of right. The repetition of 'blessed are...' (a better translation of the Greek *makarioi* than "happy are ...") provides multiple links with Israel's collection of sacred songs, the Psalms. For Israel's lyricists, God's favour or blessing is on those whose hope is in God, on those whose delight is in God's way, on those who take refuge in God, on the guileless in spirit and on those whom God forgives. The content of the beatitudes echoes the voice of Israel's prophets, especially Isaiah 61. God's spirit is upon Jesus of Nazareth. He brings the good news of God's present and future favour or blessing to the destitute and to those who mourn. The distinguishing mark of God's favoured ones is righteousness or right relationship.

God's favour or blessing on those who live the gospel message comes in diverse forms: the basileia or empire of the heavens; comfort in the face of grief; the earth for a heritage; the joy of being mercied; face to face encounter with God; a great reward "in heaven". If heaven were only a place to be enjoyed in the afterlife, it is little consolation for the desperately poor or for those who are persecuted or misrepresented, to hear that "the empire of the heavens is theirs" or that their "reward is great in heaven". "Heaven" is better understood as a way of talking about God or God's empire of justice and compassion in contrast with the heartless empire of Rome and its modern equivalents. Maybe the most urgent invitation in our present context is to mourn strategically the displacement, through war or climate crisis, of so many of earth's inhabitants who long for the blessing of God's kin-dom in the form of comfort and mercy and a share of the earth's resources. As we accept the Church's invitation to live into the way of synodality (walking together on the journey of faith), we might take time to ponder the meaning of Matthew's beatitudes and the message of hope they offer to those who espouse their vision.
