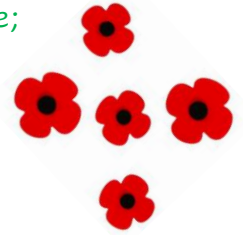

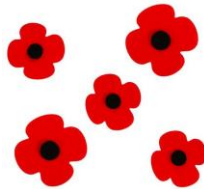

From Week Four onwards, full winter uniform will be required.

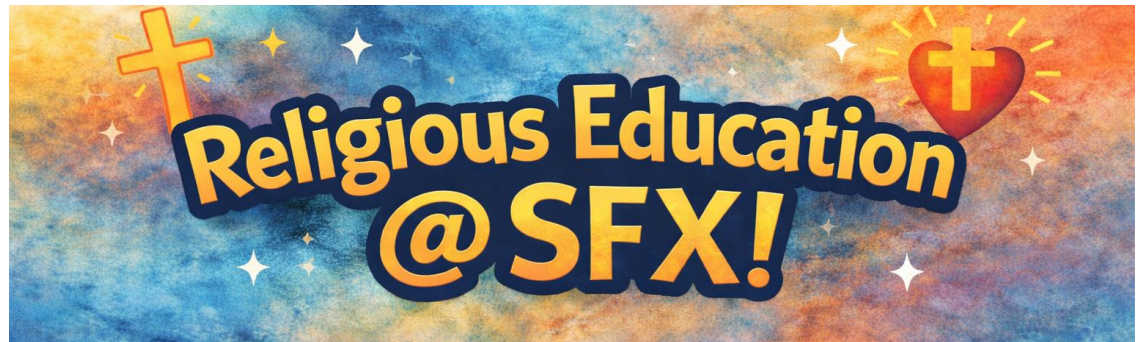

This Week's Gospel – The Road to Emmaus (Luke 24:13–35)

In this Sunday's Gospel, two disciples are walking along the road to Emmaus, feeling confused and disappointed after the events of Jesus' death. As they walk, Jesus comes alongside them, but they do not recognise him at first.

It is only later, when they sit together and break bread, that their eyes are opened and they realise that Jesus has been with them the whole time.

This Gospel reminds us that Jesus walks with us, even when we don't realise it. In moments of uncertainty, disappointment or change, we are never alone.

A message for families:

As we begin a new term, the story of Emmaus invites us to notice where Jesus might be present in our everyday lives. In conversations, in kindness, and in the people around us.

On April 25, we also commemorate ANZAC Day, a time where we remember those who have served and sacrificed for others. It is a moment to reflect on courage, service and the importance of walking alongside one another in times of need.

A family reflection:

When have we felt supported or not alone during a difficult time?

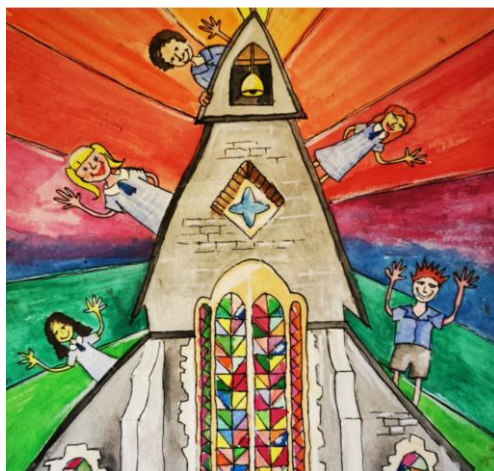
Where might we notice Jesus walking with us in our daily lives?

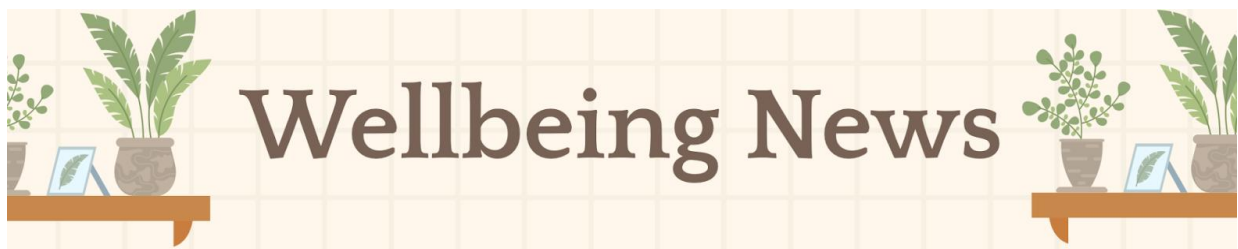
A warm invitation is extended to all our families, friends, and parish members who would like to join us in celebrating our Term Two Mass.

Welcome back to Term Two! We hope you and your family enjoyed the break together.

Many children feel a little worried returning to school after holidays and that is perfectly normal! Naturally parents also worry when their children worry! Carers ask how they can assist children when they become worried about seemingly routine events such as attending school camps and excursions, tackling difficult subjects or facing the absence of a favourite teacher. Typical responses such as ignoring their worries or allowing a child to avoid an activity that makes them anxious are unhelpful options (even if they alleviate stress in the short-term). Avoidance may make children feel safe in the moment, but it risks the establishment of a long-term pattern that can be impossible to shift (like school refusal).

Worried kids frequently look to parents and teachers for reassurance when they feel anxious. Adults don't have to fix kids' problems, but rather to validate and empower children in the worrying situation. The use of 'Ahhhh' statements to validate how a child is feeling, is a practical way to show that you are trying to understand them. 'Ahhhh, you're feeling worried about going to school camp . . . 'Ahhhh, you're having one of those "I might mess it up" thoughts . . .' Normalise that everyone has these feelings and that's OK!

Then remind them of times they've faced challenges and succeeded, even when it was difficult for them. Above all, show them you have confidence in them and know they can cope with the uncomfortable feelings anxiety brings.

Our **Read and Thrive Journal** topic this week focuses upon nature and wellbeing. Maybe your family can spend some time together this week taking a walk and enjoying this beautiful weather?

AUTHORING THE UNIVERSAL

PRAYERS (PRAYERS OF THE FAITHFUL)

Each week, a parishioner is rostered to compose the prayers of the faithful that are prayed at our Sunday Masses. Thank you to Teresa Fletcher & Allan McKinnon who continue this ministry for the Ballarat East and Buninyong church communities. We also acknowledge the late Sr Berenice Kerr RSM for her commitment to writing these prayers. Expressions of interest from parishioners to join this writing team are invited to contact the Parish Office. Formation in this ministry will be provided. Parishioners from Ballan, Bungaree, Clarkes Hill, & Dunnstown as well as Ballarat East & Buninyong are invited to join this ministry.

In the General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM), the General Intercessions, petitions, Prayer(s) of the Faithful: lots of ways this section of the liturgy is described. First up is a description of what is intended by this part of the Mass:

68. The people, for their part, stand and give expression to their prayer either by an invocation said in common after each intention or by praying in silence.

69. In the Universal Prayer or Prayer of the Faithful, the people respond in some sense to the Word of God which they have received in faith and, exercising the office of their baptismal Priesthood, offer prayers to God for the salvation of all.

70. The series of intentions is usually to be:

- a) for the needs of the church;
- b) for public authorities and the salvation of the whole world
- c) for those burdened by any kind of difficulty;
- d) for the local community.

The intentions announced should be sober, be composed with a wise liberty and in few words, and they should be expressive of the prayer of the entire community.

Engaging Your Faith is a series of short, online presentations that invite participants to reflect on what it means to be people of faith in the contemporary world. Experienced lecturers from Catholic Theological College present on a variety of topics such as science and faith issues including AI, moral theology, politics and religion, the Gospels of Matthew and John, biblical languages, canon law, and religion and ethics. Choose from 12 sessions in May 2026. Cost is \$25.00 per session for general audience; \$40.00 per session for teachers applying for Catholic school accreditation. Opening of Hearts and Minds in the Breaking of the Bread

Reflection on the Gospel-Easter 3A

(Luke 24:13-25)

Extraordinary things can happen if we open ourselves to the presence of a stranger on life's journey. That seems to be a key element in today's gospel passage from the well-known and well-loved Emmaus story. Imagine two dejected disciples (Cleopas and an unnamed disciple) on Easter Day, on the road back from Jerusalem to their home in Emmaus, a few kilometres away. On their journey, they encounter Jesus who has been raised. At first, they fail to recognise him. Their sadness at his violent death has blinded them to the significance of the women's account of the empty tomb. It has blinded them to what is happening before their very eyes.

Jesus engages them in conversation and holds up a metaphorical mirror to their experience of loss and grief. Their hearts "burn" within them as he reveals to them the meaning of his death and resurrection in the light of their sacred scriptures. Yet still they fail to recognise the one whom they have described as "a prophet mighty in deed and word." They urge him to share a meal with them despite his seeming reluctance and their eyes are opened: they recognise him in the blessing and breaking of the bread. He disappears from their midst. They cannot contain the joy they have experienced in realising that Jesus is alive and once more present to them, though in a new and transformative way.



Cleopas and partner go straight back to Jerusalem to share this good news with the other disciples. Now all the assembled disciples experience powerfully the presence of the risen Jesus in their midst. They too pass over the women's story. It is the appearance to Peter of the resurrected Christ that is the ground of their new faith. As the story continues beyond today's reading, we learn that the male disciples will also share a meal with him and he will open their minds to understand the scriptures. Everything will fall into place. The fear that has paralysed them will fall away. They will not only understand Jesus' death and resurrection in the light of the scriptures. They will be "clothed with power from on high" to exercise their role as witnesses to this great mystery.

Extraordinary things can happen to those hospitable enough to "break bread" with "strangers" in whom they do not immediately recognise God's presence. If we open our hearts to those who suffer the devastating effects of war and of the climate crisis, we might come to participate more deeply in the joy of the resurrection. Opening our hearts is always possible even if the rising cost of living makes opening of homes increasingly difficult for some. In these times, many of us know the experience of reverse ministry where those rendered poor, many of them "strangers" in our lands, show us what it means to be "of God".
